## Hockey makes promising start to '03

After nearly a month away from the ice the Hobart hockey team returned to action on Jan. 4, playing 13th-ranked Middlebury on the road in a non-conference matchup. Down 2-0 early in the third period senior **JOHN GLUEK** and first-year **COLBY McVEY** each netted goals to tie the game. However, Hobart was unable to hang on as the Panthers scored with just 45 seconds remaining to escape with a 3-2 victory.

Six days later the Statesmen hosted Geneseo in their first home ice appearance since Nov. 23. Hobart jumped ahead 1-0 on a **JESSE DESPER** goal with six minutes remaining in the opening period. Junior **CARL MICHAELSON** doubled Hobart's lead midway through the second session with a great shot into the upper right corner of the net. The Knights battled back with a score on a penalty shot and another goal with just over four minutes remaining to force overtime. Sixty-nine seconds into the five-minute extra session sophomore **ANDY BOSCHETTO** notched the game-winner to put the Statesmen past the Knights 3-2.

The following night Hobart traveled to Geneseo for a rematch with the Knights. Despite having 15 shots on goal, the Statesmen fell behind 2-0 in the first period. Hobart battled back to tie the game thanks to goals

by sophomore **CRAIG LEVEY** and first-year **LEE CARRIER** in the second and third periods, respectively. Knotted at two at the end of regulation the two teams headed to overtime for the second night in a row with neither team able to score, resulting in a 2-2 tie.

Levey's two assists and one goal against Geneseo earned him his first ECAC West Player of the Week award this season, while sophomore goalie **ADAM LAVELLE** was named Co-Goaltender of the Week for the third time after making 44 saves on 48 shots for a .917 save percentage.

Sporting an 8-6-1 record with 10 games remaining Hobart is just two wins away from matching its 10 wins in 2001-02. Pacing the Statesmen offense with nine goals and seven assists is Levey, while junior **R.C. SCHMIDT** is just behind him with six goals and eight assists. Notching 12 and 10 points, respectively, McVey and sophomore **ANDY KASPRZAK** have also been solid contributors to the Hobart frontline this season.

Between the pipes Lavelle continues to move up the ladder on Hobart's career wins and saves lists. With 1,123 saves through Jan. 11, the native of Chelmsford, Mass., is fifth on the all-time career saves list, while his 18 victories puts him in sole possession of the third spot for career wins.

## Corbett breaks career rebounds mark

It lasted 32 years, but as the saying goes records are made to be broken. On Dec. 29, senior forward **JOE CORBETT** eclipsed the career rebounding record of **CARMEN GENOVESE '70**.

Genovese pulled down 967 boards during his career, a total Corbett matched on Dec. 28, against 12th ranked and unbeaten Hanover College. In Daytona Beach, Fla., for the Amerisport Land of Magic Classic, he scored 14 points and collected nine caroms against the Panthers in an 86-62 Hobart loss. The following afternoon he claimed sole possession of the record, grabbing 15 boards. Despite 20-point efforts by **BRAD STRAIT** (25) and **DAVIDEK HERRON** (20), the Statesmen still fell 75-71.

In the latest NCAA Statistical Report (Jan. 5), Strait, who has made 23-of-26 from the line, is ranked 17th in the nation in free throw percentage, and as of Jan. 12, he ranks second in the UCAA.

Against second-ranked and unbeaten Rochester on Jan. 7, Corbett pushed his record to 989 in a 69-53 loss to the Yellowjackets. Herron paced the Hobart effort with 19 points and 10 rebounds.

The Statesmen (1-7), who have faced a brutal non-conference schedule featuring five teams ranked in the *D3Hoops.com* top 25 and Division I Colgate, posted their first win on Dec. 10, against Cazenovia.

**TIM LOMOT** torched the Wildcats for 33 points, hitting his first nine shots of the game, including seven 3-pointers. Corbett (19), Herron (16), and first-year guard Marques Rhodes (12) also reached double figures in points as Hobart topped the 'Cats 94-86.

Hobart will play its final non-conference game before diving into the UCAA slate on Jan. 14, when Hilbert visits Bristol Gym.

## Booth, Tumilowicz highlight football awards season with All-American HM

Seniors **TIM BOOTH** and **ADAM TUMILOWICZ** were named to separate All-America teams, capping off a fruitful awards season for the Hobart football team.

Booth earned honorable mention from *D3Football.com* when it announced its All-America teams before the kickoff of Stagg Bowl XXX. The 2002 UCAA Defensive Player of the Year was one of 100 Division III football players honored by the web site.

When the 25th annual Hewlett Packard NCAA Division III All-America Football Teams were announced, Tumilowicz garnered honorable mention. The silver anniversary team was selected by a panel of 29 sports information directors representing the four playoff regions in NCAA Division III.

A three-time All-UCAA first-team selection, Booth was the leader of Hobart's swarming defense that allowed just two rushing touchdowns all season and finished the season with 27 takeaways. The *Football Gazette* third-team All-East selection led the team in tackles for a loss (9.5), forced fumbles (3), and blocked kicks (2). Booth finished second on the team with a career-high 58 tackles, including a team best 41 solo stops. For his career, he compiled 163 tackles, including 42.5 tackles for a loss, 11 interceptions, and 10 sacks. Booth is also a three-time ECAC Northwest All-Star, garnering honorable mention in 2000 and

first-team accolades in 2001 and 2002.

A three-year starter at guard, Tumilowicz was a leader on Hobart's offensive line that helped the Statesmen average 132.0 yards rushing per game and a school record 221.9 yards passing per game. At 6-foot-4, 300 pounds, he is a punishing blocker with surprising quickness and excellent mobility. Tumilowicz was named first-team All-UCAA in each of the past three seasons, while garnering first-team All-ECAC Northwest this season.

Tumilowicz was a first-team All-East Region selection by the *Football Gazette*.

Sophomore running back **TY GODINHO** joined Booth and Tumilowicz on the ECAC Northwest first-team, while junior quarterback **CRAIG SWANSON** received honorable mention.

The 2001 ECAC Northwest Rookie of the Year, Godinho avoided the so-called sophomore jinx, rushing for 958 yards and 12 touchdowns and catching 24 passes for 200 yards and two more TDs. The UCAA's leading rusher ranked 33rd in the nation in scoring (8.6 ppg). Godinho posted six 100-yard rushing games this season, including a career-high 154 yards and four touchdowns against RPI on Nov. 16. Over the past two seasons, he is averaging 4.4 yards per carry and 94.8 yards per game.

Swanson enjoyed the most prolific season by a Hobart quarterback in the program's 109-season history. A finalist for the Gagliardi Trophy, presented to Division III's most outstanding player, he completed 170 of 290 passes for 2,209 yards and 21 touchdowns. Swanson is the first Statesman to throw for more than 2,000 yards in a season. In 10 games, he broke 14 Hobart game, season, and career records, including all three marks for touchdowns (4, 21, 32).

Junior linebacker **DAVID SZENTESY**, sophomore offensive lineman **ALEX BELL**, and sophomore punter **DAN SUOZZI** earned third-team All-East accolades from the *Football Gazette*.

Senior linebacker Tim Booth was named to the *D3Football.com* All-America honorable mention team. This season, he led the Statesmen in solo tackles, tackles for a loss, forced fumbles, and blocked kicks.

Szentesy led Hobart and finished third in the UCAA in tackles with 76, the most by a Statesman since 1997. A 2002 first-team All-UCAA honoree, he recorded a career-high 16 tackles at Union on Sept. 28, the most by a Statesman since 1997. Szentesy also led the Statesmen in sacks with 4.5 and in fumble recoveries with six.

Bell was also an important member of Hobart's offensive line. The 6-foot-3, 330-pounder was a second team All-UCAA selection in each of the past two seasons.

A jack-of-all-trades, Suozzi was named first-team All-UCAA at punter, wide receiver, and return specialist. He was named to the *Football Gazette* team as a punter after averaging a league leading 35.4 yards per punt. Suozzi dropped 17 of his 42 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

The Statesmen opened the season with a seven-game win streak, the program's best start in 48 years, and finished the regular season with an 8-1 record. Hobart posted a perfect 4-0 record in the UCAA, the Statesmen's first unbeaten season in the league. Hobart earned its second NCAA Tournament invitation in three seasons, falling in the first round to 11th-ranked and eventual semifinalist John Carroll University.

# Navigating the online home of the Statesmen

When I graduated high school in 1992, fans found the score of a game by watching the 11 o'clock news or reading about it in the next day's newspaper.

By the time I graduated college and began an internship with Hobart and William Smith in 1996, the net-savvy fan could find scores on the Colleges' web site, but not much more.

When I returned as SID in 1999, press releases were just starting to appear on [www.hws.edu](http://www.hws.edu). Today, there are more than 1,200 press releases online about the Colleges' sports teams alone.

This is the first in a series of columns that will help SAA members navigate the home of the Statesmen:

Before going any further, it's worth noting that the Colleges' web site works best when viewed with Microsoft's Internet Explorer. Most of the site will work with Netscape and other browsers, but some of the "bells and whistles" of the site may not.

We'll start with the games, since that's where it all begins.

All of the HWS athletic teams web sites are set up essentially the same. Visiting the basketball home page ([www.hws.edu/statesmen/basketball](http://www.hws.edu/statesmen/basketball)) will bring you to an introduction page with a list of additional basketball pages to visit located below the Hobart logo: schedule/results, team news, coaching staff, roster, stats, photos, and links.

To find the start time or location of an upcoming game or the score of a game already played, click on schedule/results.

For home games, results are usually posted within an hour of the completion of the contest, while the results of road games are posted within 24 hours, excluding Sundays.

Also located off of the schedule and results pages are the box scores for contests. A game's box score will be posted just to the right of the score. (There are no naviga-

tion links on the box scores, so you'll need to use the back button on your browser to return to the previous page.)

For the story behind the stats, click on Team News in the menu below the Hobart logo. Here you'll find a complete recap of home games, as well as selected road contests, postseason games, and additional newsworthy events.

For those of you who can't wait for the game to get over and want to know what's happening during the game, you're going to love the newest feature on the site.

The Sports Information staff now offers live real-time statistics online. Thanks to Stat Crew Software's Automated Scorebook, the Colleges will now provide live stats for home games in basketball, lacrosse, football, and soccer.

A link to access the live stats page will be available on the schedule/results page where the box score link will later appear.

The live stats page will look similar to the image below. Live stats will feature links to quick stats (the default view), individual stats, team stats, and play-by-play. These links are located above the line score at the top of the page.

The page will automatically refresh itself every 10 seconds, so you'll be kept up-to-date on all the twists and turns in the action.

Live Internet stats will make their basketball debut at Hobart on Jan. 14, when the Statesmen host Hilbert at 7 p.m.

# Lax names '03 captains

GENEVA, N.Y.—Head Coach MATT KERWICK '90 recently announced the Statesmen's captains for the 2003 lacrosse season. Seniors JOHN BOGOSIAN, TIM BOOTH, and MIKE BORSZ were selected by their teammates to lead Hobart this season.

Bogosian, who was named to the All-Patriot League teams in each of the past two seasons, is on pace to become just the second Division I Statesman to score 100 career points (55-34-89). The attackman led the team in scoring in 2002 with 29 goals and eight assists. Bogosian also led Hobart in scoring in 2001 with 24 goals and 24 assists.

Booth, who also served as a team captain last season, is the Statesmen's top faceoff man. Over the past three seasons, he's compiled a record of 313-240 (.566) on restarts, while collecting 25 goals, 10 assists, and 180 ground balls. A 2002 first-team All-Patriot League selection, Booth ranked ninth in the nation in faceoff percentage (.598, 146-244) and 11th in ground balls (6.2/g).

A two-year starter, Borsz earned second-team All-Patriot League honors last season in goal. Through three seasons, he boasts a .543 save percentage and 337 saves, which rank fifth on Hobart's career list. Borsz was twice named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week last season.

The Statesmen enter their 101st season fresh off of their 24th NCAA Tournament appearance, and their second Patriot League Championship since 2000. Hobart returns 25 letterwinners and seven starters from 2002's 6-8 squad, including 71 percent of the team's scoring.

The Statesmen open the season on Feb. 23, against Butler in Baltimore, Md.
