Defense leads lacrosse past Mountain Hawks, 9-4

GENEVA, N.Y.—The Hobart defense continued its strong showing over Patriot League opponents, limiting visiting Lehigh University to just three even strength goals, as the Statesmen topped the Mountain Hawks 9-4 at AstroTurf Stadium in front of 1,153 fans. Senior goalie **MIKE BORSZ** went the distance and earned the win with 11 saves.

Hobart's defense limited Lehigh's top two scorers to one goal apiece. The Mountain Hawks also struggled to solve Hobart's man-down defense, taking advantage of just 1-of-9 extra-man opportunities.



While the Statesmen may not have produced as many goals as Coach **MATT KERWICK** would have liked, it wasn't because of a lack of opportunities. Senior **TIM BOOTH** dominated the faceoff X, winning 11-of-15 restarts and collecting 11 ground balls.

The Statesmen offense got off to a fast start. First-year **PATRICK MEADE** rifled home a shot at the 11:24 mark. Senior **JOHN BOGOSIAN**, the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week, made it a two-goal game less than two minutes later, and Meade added his second tally just 10 seconds before the end of the opening frame.

In the second quarter, Lehigh got on the board just 18 seconds into the stanza. The goal halted Borsz's shutout streak against League opponents, dating back to the 2002 Holy Cross game, at 102 minutes, 29 seconds.

Bogosian responded with a man-up goal. Lehigh scored 33 seconds later, but senior **SEAN KENT** answered with his second goal of

the season to send Hobart into the break with a 5-2 lead.

The third quarter saw Bogosian sandwich a pair of goals around a Lehigh tally to build a 7-3 lead with 15 minutes remaining. With four goals and an assist, he raised his team-leading point total to 21. The Mountain Hawks continued to hang around, closing to within three, 7-4, at the 13:05 mark of the fourth on a man-up goal.

Senior long-stick midfielder **BRYAN BOME** iced the game with his first collegiate goal at 7:08, and sophomore **NATE HILL** added the final goal of the afternoon 15 seconds before the final horn.

Merrick, Cline take 6th at sailing World Championships

AUCKLAND, New Zealand—Assistant sailing coach **COLIN MERRICK '01** and senior **JOHN CLINE** joined four other sailors on Team Silver Panda at the International Sailing Federation World Championships, finishing in sixth place out of 16 teams. The other team from the United States, Team Whishbone, grabbed the title after finishing second the previous two years.

Silver Panda qualified for the Gold League Round Robins after finishing in the top half of the initial round-robin event. The team continued to race well going 12-9 in the three round robins to finish fourth just behind Whishbone (15-6). However, due to the rule that a country can advance only one team to the final round of four, Silver Panda was bumped out of the finals.

"It's an unfortunate rule, but since it's a race of nations and the other team from the United States beat us all three times in the Gold Round, they ended up advancing," Merrick said. "It was frustrating, but it was a great experience."

Merrick and Cline qualified for the World Championships after winning the 14-team Hinman Championship this past November.

A native of Portsmouth, R.I., Merrick was a three-time member of the Coed All-America Sailing Team during his four years at Hobart. Cline represented HWS on the Mid-Atlantic Intercollegiate Sailing Association All-District Team in the fall of 2001 and 2002.

Sailing captures Admiral Moore title

THROGGS NECK, N.Y.—The sailing team raced its way to a first place finish at the Admiral Moore regatta hosted by New York Maritime College. HWS accumulated 94 points, with Old Dominion University coming in second with 127.

Winning the A Division were junior **OSCAR BARNEY** and sophomore **ERIC OPPEN** with 55 points. The two combined for six top-five finishes, winning twice. Their next closest opponent was the pair from MIT with 57 points.

Senior **JOHN STORK** and junior **MORA O'MALLEY** took second in the B Division with 94 points in 10 races, just two points behind top finisher Old Dominion.

Field. First-year **MIKE CONKLIN** led all scorers with four goals and an assist, earning the Patriot League Rookie of the Week Award.

The Statesmen's defense, led by senior goalie **MIKE BORSZ**, negated the Leopards' attack. Borsz played the opening 30 minutes, posting nine saves, including at least three from point-blank-range, without allowing a goal.

Meanwhile, Hobart's offense posted four scores in the opening 15, including a pair of goals by senior **JOHN BOGOSIAN**. The Statesmen began to fire on all cylinders in the second stanza.

Bogosian kick started a seven-goal quarter for Hobart with his third of the game. Senior **KRIS SHORE**, junior **GEOFF ZBIKOWSKI**, senior **TIM BOOTH**, and junior **MARK WILLIAMSON** followed with single tallies to balloon the Statesmen's lead to 9-0 with 3:26 remaining in the first half.

Conklin scored twice—just 11 seconds apart—in the final two minutes to send Hobart into halftime with an 11-0 lead.

Lafayette finally broke through the Statesmen defense in the second half as the Hobart coaching staff began to empty the bench. In fact, the Leopards scored six of the first seven goals of the second half to creep to within six, 12-6, with 9:47 remaining in the game. Pat Lennon led the Leopards in scoring with four goals.

The Statesmen dashed any hopes of a comeback with four of the final five goals.

#5 Georgetown 13, Hobart 5

SAN ANTONIO—For the first time in 32 years, two Division I lacrosse programs squared off in Texas. The fifth-ranked Georgetown Hoyas lived up to their billing, topping the Statesmen 13-5 at the Texas Military Institute's Howell Field. The teams ended up in Texas during Spring Break thanks to David Cole '59, the lacrosse coach at TMI.

"Dave came back last summer and worked our camp," said coach **MATT KERWICK**. "He was full of energy and great with the kids, especially the younger ones. He was also full of energy trying to get a game down here."

The Statesmen opened the scoring at the 10:28 mark of the first quarter, but the Hoyas responded with the next six tallies.

Junior **BRIAN JOY** broke the run with 32 seconds remaining in the half with a man-up goal, but the Hoyas answered just four seconds later to take a 7-2 lead.

The teams traded goals in the third quarter, but the Hoyas scored four straight to start the fourth and put the game out of reach.

With a pair of goals, senior **JOHN BOGOSIAN** became just the fourth Statesman to play four seasons of Division I lacrosse (Hobart elevated the program in 1995) and score 100 career points. **NATHAN ROOST '98**, **JARED BEBEE '00**, and **JAMIE BRESLIN '01** preceded him.

Tennis returns to Geneva for 3 match homestand

In search of warmer weather the Hobart tennis team opened its spring season in Hilton Head, S.C. Playing five matches in six days, the Statesmen returned home with a 3-2 record, raising their overall mark to 5-3.

Hobart breezed past its first two opponents, defeating Salve Regina 5-1 and Edinboro 6-1. Dropping just five sets in the opening two matches, the Statesmen continued their strong singles play the next day, winning four of their six singles matches for a 4-3 victory over the College of Wooster.

After a day of rest, Hobart returned to the clay courts against Green Mountain College, ranked 21st among NAIA teams. The Eagles proved to be too much downing the Statesmen 6-1. The following afternoon the Statesmen fell to 3-2 with a 5-2 loss against Wittenberg University.

In its first match back from Hilton Head, Hobart was handed a 7-0 defeat by a tough University of Rochester team.

Leading the way with a 13-4 overall record is sophomore **PETER PINÉ** in the first singles spot, while junior **TREVOR McANDREW** sports a 5-3 record at the third position. The Statesmen have a three-game homestand, hosting RIT, St. Lawrence, and St. John Fisher, in the coming week.

Corbett continues to collect honors

GENEVA, N.Y.—Hobart forward **JOE CORBETT** continued to collect postseason hardware after a record-breaking career. During the Division III Championship Weekend (March 21-22), the senior was named first-team All-East by the National Association of Basketball Coaches and received honorable mention All-American accolades from *D3Hoops.com*. *D3Hoops.com* is the definitive Internet resource for Division III basketball.

A three-time NABC All-East selection, Corbett boasts 33 percent of Hobart's all-time NABC All-East honors. He was also a two-time *D3Hoops.com* first-team All-East selection, and a three-time All-Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association first-teamer.

Corbett led Hobart in scoring (20.1 ppg), rebounding (14.4 rpg), and field goal percentage (.541) this season. His rebounding average leads the nation, according to the March 16 NCAA Statistical Report.

Hobart's career scoring and rebounding leader, Corbett finished his career with 1,701 points, 1,249 rebounds, and 69 double-doubles. He eclipsed **MIKE MASINO'S** 15 year-old scoring mark by 38 points, and bested **CARMEN GENOVESE'S** 33-year old rebounding record by 282.

An outstanding student and community member, Corbett was a two-time finalist for the Jostens Trophy, presented to the Division III Player of the Year, taking into account academics and community service, as well as basketball prowess.

Corbett led Hobart to a 53-50 record over four seasons, making the Class of 2003 the first group of Statesmen to graduate with a winning record since 1991. In 2001, he helped Hobart tie the school record for consecutive wins, on its way to winning the UCAA Championship and a spot in the program's first NCAA Tournament.
