# HEAD COACH RICH ROCHE '87



The first man to lead the Statesmen to the NCAA Basketball Championship Tournament, **RICH ROCHE** became the 15th man to lead the Hobart basketball program on Aug. 4, 1997. No stranger to the Hobart family, he was a four-year letterman and team captain for the Statesmen, garnering the Charles E. Love Memorial Award for scholarship, leadership, and all around value to his team.

After just five seasons, Roche ranks fourth on the school's career wins list and fifth on the winning percentage list, while boasting the highest wins per season of any Hobart basketball mentor. His progress with a program that featured just three winning seasons between 1978-79 and 1996-97 has not gone unnoticed.

He was named the 2001 UCAA, RACA, NABC East Region, and BCANY Upstate Coach of the Year. Roche has mentored a finalist for the Jostens Trophy (Division III Player of the Year), four NABC All-East selections, three UCAA Players of the Year, and a UCAA Rookie of the Year.

His direction hit a high-water mark for the program during the 2000-01 campaign, breaking the school record for wins in a season with a 20-8 mark, including an 11-3 record in conference play. In the UCAA Tournament, the Statesmen ran the table, claiming their first league title. The victory earned them a spot in the NCAA Tournament, while their record warranted a first round bye.

Roche returned to his alma mater from Saint Anthony's High School, where he taught history for eight years and coached the basketball team for six seasons. During this time, Roche rebuilt a tradition-rich program compiling an 80-64 record, produced 17 college players and reestablished the South Huntington, N.Y., school as a state Catholic power. In 1993, his Friars won the Long Island Catholic League Championship, and Roche received Coach of the Year honors. In 1997, St. Anthony's made another trip to the league finals in a season that included a victory over national high school power Christ the King of New York City.

Roche earned a master's degree in education from Villanova University in 1994, and spent the 1993-94 season as an assistant coach to Steve Lappas. That season the Wildcats compiled a 20-12 record in winning the National Invitation Tournament championship at Madison Square Garden.

Prior to being named head coach at St. Anthony's, Roche spent single season stints as an assistant coach at SUNY-Farmingdale and New York Institute of Technology.

A native of Oceanside, N.Y., Roche and his wife, Melissa, reside in Geneva.



## ASSISTANT COACHES



**JOE WOJTYLKO** joins the Hobart coaching staff for his first season with the Statesmen. A native of Ocala, Fla., Wojtylko is a 2000 graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in history and philosophy. At the NCAA Division II institution, Wojtylko was awarded an athletic scholarship to play for the Bobcats, earning Most Valuable Defensive Player for the 1998-99 campaign.

Following graduation, Wojtylko put on the coaching hat for the Bobcats, helping to lead West Virginia Wesleyan to its most successful season in 10 years. As the assistant, he coordinated all aspects of recruiting and supervised team academic affairs. He also put together a strength and

conditioning program for the players.

Wojtylko will assist Head Coach Rich Roche with recruiting, scouting, and working with the big men during practice.



**DENNIS PYSNACK** enters his 14th season as an assistant coach in the Hobart basketball program. He will play an integral roll in scouting and local recruiting as well as in practice on a daily basis.

Pysnack, who began his career at Hobart one year after Head Coach Rich Roche graduated, provides the program with stability and continuity.

A gifted clinician, Pysnack has been active in the area junior leagues for several years. He is a native of Seneca Falls, N.Y., and resides in Seneca Falls with his wife Trish.



**CARL WENZEL** begins his second season as a collegiate assistant coach following a highly successful tenure as the Head Coach of the Geneva High School boys varsity team. Wenzel joined the Statesmen with more than 30 years of experience as a basketball coach and player.

Wenzel has been a teacher in the Geneva City School District since 1975. He coached the boys junior varsity basketball team from 1975-76 through 1979-80. For 21 seasons, he guided the Panther's varsity basketball team to a 265-182 (.593) record. Under his leadership, Geneva won three consecutive Finger Lakes East Championships (1982-84). Wenzel was named the Section V Class AA Coach of the

Year in 1982 and '83. He also led the Panthers to Sectional Championships in 1989 (Class B) and again in 1999 (Class BB).

A 1974 graduate of St. John Fisher College, Wenzel started three seasons for the Cardinals. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

He and his wife, Ann, and their three children live in Geneva.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

The Hobart basketball team enters the 2002-03 campaign with some significant milestones on the horizon. The Class of 2003 Statesmen will attempt to become the first class to graduate with a winning record since the Class of 1991. This year's seniors, center **JOE CORBETT**, forwards **DAVIDEK HERRON**, **JEFF HILL**, and **ROCCO WALSH**, and guard **TIM LOMOT**, begin the campaign with a 43-35 mark.

More importantly, Hobart will be in search of a return to the UCAA Championship Tournament and the NCAA Tournament beyond that. The Statesmen won the 2001 UCAA title and made their first NCAA Tournament appearance, but last season Hobart struggled to a 12-13 overall record and a 7-7 mark in the league. The coaches and players are eager to prove last season was an aberration and return to the national scene.

The return trip will be far from easy. Hobart begins the season with a challenging non-conference schedule that includes Division I Colgate, 2001 NCAA semifinalist Rochester (on Dec. 3 and Jan. 7), perennial power Franklin & Marshall, and 2001 NCAA Invitees

Ithaca and Cazenovia. The Statesmen will also travel to tournaments in Welland, Ontario, and Daytona Beach, Fla.

Beyond that Hobart has a demanding Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association slate that includes five games, all on the road, in just nine days.

In the frontcourt, the Statesmen have two of the best scoring and rebounding tandems in the East Region in Corbett and Herron.

Averaging a double-double for his career with 16.2 ppg and 12.0 rpg, Corbett needs just 50 rebounds to break the 32-year old career record set by Carmen Genovese '70. His pursuit of that record was dealt a setback in the preseason, when he fractured his knee cap. Hobart's top rebounder over the past three seasons is expected back before Christmas.

When Corbett returns he will also begin his chase of the Statesmen's career scoring record. Mike Masino '88 established that benchmark with 1,663 markers and Corbett starts the year 424 points shy of that total. The 2002 NABC first-team All-East selection and Jostens Trophy finalist has scored at least 445 points in each of the past two seasons.

Should defenses think they're going to collapse on Corbett and take their chances with the rest of the team, Herron stands ready to take advantage. Nearly as dominant as Corbett, Herron ranked in the top 40 in the nation in rebounding last season and boasts 30 career double-doubles. One of three Statesmen to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau, Herron

a year wiser, expect Lomot to cutdown on his turnovers while building on his scoring average (7.3 ppg in '01-02).

The remaining two starting roles will be up for grabs. Juniors **TREVOR MCANDREW** and **BRAD STRAIT** and sophomores **ERIC JACKS** and **ZACK STELZNER** all will figure into the rotation. McAndrew sees the floor well and is capable of creating opportunities for himself and his teammates off the dribble, while Strait is a pure shooter, capable of playing everything from the point to small forward.

Both Jacks and Stelzner saw limited playing time as first-years. Jacks possesses a quick first step and is a solid ball handler, while Stelzner is just as speedy and tough as nails defensively.

Hobart also welcomes six first-years into the backcourt. **MARQUES RHODES** and **COLBY FEANE** headline the Class of 2006. Both players are capable of cracking the starting lineup before midseason. A product of the Capital District's Brewster Academy, Rhodes is a natural shooting guard, but very capable of running the point. The all-time leading scorer at nearby Weedsport High School, Feane will be a step behind his teammates in the opening weeks of the season, thanks to an NCAA Playoff run by Hobart's football team, where he served as the backup place kicker. An intelligent and well-conditioned athlete, the coaching staff expects him to catch up very quickly.

Rookies **JON DONENFELD**, a junior transfer, and first-years **MIKE GOLDMAN**, **MIKE STAKIAS**, and **JESSE TAWIL** all could see playing time off the bench.

posted back-to-back 30-point games against Union and Skidmore last season. He posted career highs in points (16.7 ppg), field goal percentage (.505), and assists (39) in 2001-02.

Walsh, Hill, and sophomore **JOE FLACKE** are expected to spell Corbett and Herron. Walsh is a tireless worker, who makes the most of his minutes on the court. Hill is a question mark for this season due to an offseason knee injury, but the coaches are keeping their fingers crossed to have his shooter's touch back in the lineup in time for the conference schedule. Last season's team rookie of the year, Flacke possesses good range on his jumper and improved his defensive skills throughout the season.

First-year **TIM APUZZO** (6-foot-6, 220 pounds) will also be in the hunt for playing time down low.

In the backcourt, the Statesmen will start three guards. Lomot will run the point again this year. An exciting and extremely creative passer, he struggled with turnovers at times last season trying to create something out of nothing. A year older and





Hobart and William Smith Colleges are coordinate, private, liberal arts institutions, located in Geneva, N.Y., the heart of the Finger Lakes Region. The Colleges, which have a combined enrollment of 1,885, offer a remarkably broad array of majors and minors, with a cross-disciplinary flavor intended to better inform both professional and intellectual pursuits. The Colleges are noted also for an ambitious emphasis on international study, and for their programs in community service. Hobart College for men and William Smith College for women share faculty, facilities, and curriculum, but maintain separate dean's offices, athletics programs, student governments, and traditions.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

At the Colleges, the academic year is divided into two 15-week semesters. Students take four courses each term, eight per year, for either a bachelor of arts or bachelor of science degree. The academic program traditionally comprises four years.

Majors are available in African/Africana studies, American studies, anthropology, architectural studies, arts and education, art history, Asian languages and cultures, biology, chemistry, classics, comparative literature, computer science, critical social studies, dance, economics, English, environmental studies, European studies, French, geoscience, Greek, history, international relations, Latin, Latin American studies, lesbian, gay, and bisexual studies, mathematics, media and society, modern languages, music, philosophy, physics, political science, psychology, public policy studies, religious studies, Russian area studies, sociology, Spanish, studio art, urban studies, women's studies, and writing and rhetoric.

Hobart is a member of the Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (UCAA), the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), and Divisions III and I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).



## PRESIDENT MARK D. GEARAN

Mark D. Gearan, bringing extensive experience in public service and a strong commitment to undergraduate liberal arts education and international studies, became Hobart College's 26th president and William Smith College's 15th president in August 1999.

When named to that position by the Colleges' trustees, Gearan was serving as director of the U.S. Peace Corps in Washington, D.C., a position he assumed in 1995. His extensive credentials in public policy and service include having served at the White House as Assistant to the President, Director of Communications, and Deputy Chief of Staff.

A native of Gardner, Mass., Gearan earned a bachelor's degree in government *cum laude* at Harvard University and a law degree from Georgetown University. His writings have been published extensively, including pieces in the "Boston Globe," the "Miami Herald," and the "San Francisco Examiner."



## DEAN OF HOBART COLLEGE CLARENCE E. BUTLER

Clarence E. Butler became dean of Hobart College in July, 1998. Butler came to Hobart in 1979, after serving on the faculties at Brown University and Dartmouth College. He served as assistant dean, then was named senior associate dean in 1983 after serving for two years as acting dean of the College.

Butler has served on many committees, including the Committee on Standards, Individual Major Committee, and President's Advisory Council. Aside from his administrative duties, Butler has taught classes in German and, as an Episcopal priest, has at times served the local community in that capacity as well.

Butler received bachelor's and doctoral degrees from Washington University in St. Louis, a master's from the University of Kansas, and the B.D. from the Episcopal Theological School. He also received a language diploma from the University of Stockholm in Sweden. He is a former Fulbright Scholar and DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Scholar.



## HOBART DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MICHAEL J. HANNA '68

A 1968 graduate of Hobart, Michael J. Hanna became the College's athletics director in 1981. He has piloted the athletics program through unprecedented championships in lacrosse, and his vision, along with that of his William Smith counterpart, has led to the construction of the Robert A. Bristol '31 Field House in 1989 and the Dr. Frank P. Smith '36 Squash Center in 1998. Improvements in the new millennium include an AstroTurf stadium, Cozzens Memorial Field, and the Topichak Team Rooms in the Elliott Varsity House.

As a quarterback, Hanna broke all of Hobart's season and career passing records during the 1966 and 1967 seasons. A second-team All-American lacrosse attackman in 1968, Hanna finished second for the Statesmen in scoring that year with 35 goals and 35 assists. He co-captained both the football and lacrosse teams his senior year. During his senior year he was awarded the Francis L. "Babe" Kraus Award as Hobart's Athlete of the Year and was also presented the Judge Kane Award as MVP in lacrosse.
