HEAD COACH RICH ROCHE '87

The first coach to lead the Statesmen to the NCAA Basketball Championship Tournament, Rich Roche became the 15th man to lead the Hobart basketball program on Aug. 4, 1997. No stranger to the Hobart family, he was a four-year letterman and team captain for the Statesmen, garnering the Charles E. Love Memorial Award for scholarship, leadership, and all-around value to his team.

After just five seasons, Roche ranks fourth on the school's career wins list and fifth on the winning percentage list, while boasting the highest wins per season of any Hobart basketball mentor. His progress

with a program that featured just three winning seasons between 1978-79 and 1996-97 has not gone unnoticed. He was named the 2001 UCAA, RACA, NABC East Region, and BCANY Upstate Coach of the Year. Roche has mentored a two-time finalist for the Jostens Trophy, presented to the Division III Player of the Year, as well as four All-Region selections, three UCAA Players of the Year, and a UCAA Rookie of the Year.

His direction hit a high-water mark for the program during the 2000-01 campaign, breaking the school record for wins in a season with a 20-8 mark, including an 11-3 record in conference play. In the UCAA Tournament, the Statesmen ran the table, claiming their first league title. The victory earned them a spot in the NCAA Tournament, while their record warranted a first round bye.

Roche returned to his alma mater from Saint Anthony's High School, where he taught history for eight years and coached the basketball team for six seasons. During this time, Roche rebuilt a tradition rich program, compiled an 80-64 record, produced 17 college players, and re-established the South Huntington, N.Y., school as a state Catholic power. In 1993, his Friars won the Long Island Catholic League Championship, and Roche received Coach of the Year honors. In 1997, St. Anthony's made another trip to the league finals in a season that included a victory over national high school power Christ the King of New York City.

Roche earned a master's degree in education from Villanova University in 1994,

and spent the 1993-94 season as an assistant coach to Steve Lappas. That season the Wildcats compiled a 20-12 record in winning the National Invitation Tournament championship at Madison Square Garden.

Prior to being named head coach at St. Anthony's, Roche spent single season stints as an assistant coach at SUNY-Farmingdale and New York Institute of Technology.

A native of Oceanside, N.Y., Roche and his wife. Melissa, reside in Geneva with their daughter. Hannah.





ASSISTANT COACH JOE WOJTYLKO

Joe Wojtylko is in his second season on the Hobart coaching staff. A native of Ocala, Fla., Wojtylko is a 2000 graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College, where he earned bachelor's degrees in history and philosophy. An NCAA Division II institution, Wojtylko was awarded an athletic scholarship to play for the Bobcats, earning Most Valuable Defensive Player for the 1998-99 campaign.

Following graduation, Wojtylko put on the coaching hat for the Bobcats, helping to lead WVWC to its most successful season in 10 years. As the assistant, he coordi-

nated all aspects of recruiting and supervised team academic affairs. He also put together a strength and conditioning program for the players.

Wojtylko assists Head Coach Rich Roche with recruiting, scouting, and working with the big men during practice.



ASSISTANT COACH DENNIS PYSNACK

Dennis Pysnack enters his 14th season as an assistant coach in the Hobart basketball program. He plays an integral roll in scouting and local recruiting, as well as practice on a daily basis.

Pysnack, who began his career at Hobart one year after Head Coach Rich Roche graduated, provides the program with stability and continuity.

A gifted clinician, Pysnack has been active in the area junior leagues for several years. He is a native of Seneca Falls, N.Y., where he lives with his wife, Trish.



ASSISTANT COACH CARL WENZEL

Carl Wenzel is in his second season as a collegiate assistant coach. Wenzel joined the Statesmen with more than 30 years of experience as a high school basketball coach.

Wenzel has been a teacher in the Geneva City School District since 1975. He coached the boy's junior varsity basketball team from 1975-76 through 1979-80. For the next 21 seasons, he guided the Panther's varsity basketball team to a 265-182 (.593) record. Under his leadership, Geneva won three consecutive Finger Lakes East Champi-

onships (1982-84). Wenzel was named the Section V Class AA Coach of the Year in 1982 and '83. He also led the Panthers to Sectional Championships in 1989 (Class B) and 1999 (Class BB).

A 1974 graduate of St. John Fisher College, Wenzel started three seasons for the Cardinals. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

He and his wife, Ann, and their three children live in Geneva.

2003-04 Season Outlook

eplacing two graduated seniors who are now making a living in the pros is nothing new for the likes of Duke, Kansas, and Arizona, but the Hobart Statesmen will be in uncharted waters in 2003-04.


For the past four seasons, forwards **JOE CORBETT '03** and **DAVIDEK HERRON '03** have

been a potent one-two punch for the Statesmen. A two-time Jostens Trophy finalist and three-time NABC All-East selection, Corbett led the team in scoring and rebounding in each of the past three seasons, rewriting the records book along the way. Hobart's all-time leading scorer and rebounder finished his career with 1,701 points and 1,249 rebounds, knocking down a record 54.9 percent from the floor.

Much more than Robin to Corbett's Batman, Herron was an exceptional player in his own right. A big man with range (.326 3FG%), he finished sixth on Hobart's career scoring list with 1,449 points while corralling 861 rebounds. Herron earned All-UCAA honors in three of his four seasons, finishing second to Corbett in points and rebounds in each of those campaigns.

By the start of the 2003-04 academic year, Corbett had signed with BK Amager of the Danish First Division, while Herron signed with SC Bayer of the German Third Division by the start of preseason practices.

The task facing Head Coach **RICH ROCHE '87** and his staff this season is a daunting one. Not only will the Statesmen be without Corbett and Herron, the

graduation of guard **TIM LOMOT** and forward **ROCCO WALSH** means the Class of 2003 takes with them 62 percent of last season's scoring and 64 percent of its rebounding.

This year's squad will be a no-name team, without superstars. The Statesmen have the personnel to score from every position, but without the standouts who are expected to score, as in the past.

Senior shooting guard **BRAD STRAIT** and sophomore point guard **COLBY FEANE** return to their starting roles. Strait, who averaged 11.2 ppg and 2.4 apg last year in his first season as a starter, will bear the lion's share of the leadership responsibility as the only senior on Hobart's roster. A dogged defender, Strait emerged as a reliable scorer in 2002-03, producing 12 double digit efforts highlighted by a career-high 30 at Vassar. His success from long range (.335 3FG% career) will play a key role in opening up the middle for Hobart's relatively inexperienced big men.

A two-sport athlete, Feane joins the cagers when the Hobart football season comes to a close. After helping the Statesmen win the UCAA Championship and earn an NCAA

Tournament berth on the gridiron, he needed just five games on the hardwood to work his way into the starting lineup at point guard as a first-year. In his first start, Feane produced eight points and six assists. This season the coaches will work with the Weedsport native on building on his 2.8 apg while cutting down on the turnovers that are the signature of so many rookie seasons.

The Statesmen will run a three guard system this season, with the third starting role up for grabs. Juniors **ERIC JACKS** and **ZACK STELZNER** will compete for minutes in that role. Neither player has averaged more than 10 minutes per game in a season, but both bring intense defensive pressure and great court vision. Jacks scored a career-high 10 points in the season opener at Division I Colgate last season, connecting on all three of his field goal attempts and 4-of-6 from the line, while Stelzner produced an efficient five-point, five-assist effort at Vassar.



Junior forward Joe Flacke is expected to step into the starting lineup this season.

First-year **MIKE MANNING** is the most athletic and talented guard in the Class of

2007. A Class C All-State selection from Mastic, N.Y., he is an exceptional athlete with the uncanny ability to beat an opponent off the dribble or just shoot over the top of them. Blessed with speed, Manning fits perfectly into Hobart's up-tempo game plan and will contribute right away, possibly grabbing a starting job before the end of the year.

In the frontcourt, junior **JOE FLACKE** returns the most game-experienced (47 gms), but in limited minutes (7.8/g). With the loss of Corbett and Herron, Flacke's playing time will expand, giving him the opportunity to showcase his low post moves as well as the range on his jumper.

Standing alongside Flacke in the starting lineup will be sophomore **TIM APUZZO**. The native of Cumberland, Maine, started the first two games for an injured Corbett in 2002, and benefited greatly from daily battles with Corbett and Herron in practice. Apuzzo showed his scoring potential in back-to-back games with Vassar and Union, dropping in 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting. At 6-foot-5, 225 pounds, he's an intimidating presence, as Hamilton found out in a double overtime loss in Geneva, in which Apuzzo blocked four shots.

Coach Roche will have a host of first-years to choose from off of the bench. **BILLY CLARKE**, **MATT TUCCIARONE**, **MICHAEL MASTRO**, and **DAN MATUZAK** have distinguished themselves in the preseason. Clarke (6'4", 185) and Tucciarone (6'5", 175) are both sharpshooting swingmen, while Mastro (6'4", 195), a *Newsday* All-Long Island selection, and Matuzak (6'6", 225) are physical, pound-it-inside players.

Add to this mix junior offensive lineman **ALEX BELL**, who is back in a basketball uniform for the first time since high school, and junior transfer **WOODY KAMPMANN** (Colby College) and the Statesmen will have plenty of options in the low post.





About Hobart and William Smith Colleges

Hobart and William Smith Colleges are private, coordinate, liberal-arts colleges in Geneva, N.Y. Hobart College was founded in 1822, William Smith College in 1908. Hobart enrolls 831 men and William Smith 1,035 women. The full-time equivalent teaching faculty numbers 179.5 members, 98 percent of whom hold doctoral degrees.

The two colleges have the same faculty; classes are coeducational; and students use the same library and laboratories. Each college, however, awards its own degrees, has its own dean, and maintains its own student government and athletics programs.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

At the Colleges, the academic year is divided into two 15-week semesters. Students take four courses each semester, eight each year, for either a bachelor of arts or bachelor of science degree. The academic program traditionally comprises four years.

Majors are available in African/Africana studies; American studies; anthropology; architectural studies; arts and education; art history; Asian languages and cultures; biology; chemistry; classics; comparative literature; computer science; critical social studies; dance; economics; English; environmental studies; European studies; French; geoscience; Greek; history; international relations; Latin; Latin American studies; lesbian, gay and bisexual studies; mathematics; media and society; modern languages; music; philosophy; physics; political science; psychology; public policy studies; Russian area studies; sociology; Spanish; studio art; urban studies; women's studies; and writing and rhetoric.

Individual majors may be developed in consultation with an adviser. In addition, the Colleges offer a master of arts degree in education.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Hobart College Department of Athletics believes that intercollegiate athletics play a major role in the educational process, and strives to provide a challenging, meaningful, and exciting experience for student-athletes. Hobart is a member of the Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (UCAA), the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), and Divisions III and I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).



The Administration PRESIDENT MARK D. GEARAN

Mark D. Gearan is a college president whose life exemplifies the strongest attributes of Hobart and William Smith Colleges: civic engagement, global awareness, a focus on the 21st century, and a commitment to students.

When named president in 1999, President Gearan was serving as director of the Peace Corps in Washington, D.C., a post he assumed in 1995. Prior to his Peace Corps directorship, he served at the White House as Assistant to the President and Director of Communications, as well as Deputy Chief of Staff.

A native of Gardner, Mass., President Gearan earned a bachelor's degree in government cum laude at Harvard University and a law degree from Georgetown University. He is also the recipient of 12 honorary degrees. President Gearan was confirmed by the U.S. Senate to serve on the board of the Corporation for National and Community Service, and was appointed to the national board of The Partnership of Public Service. He also serves on the board of the National Campus Compact and co-chairs the New York Campus Compact Executive Committee.



DEAN OF HOBART COLLEGE CLARENCE E. BUTLER

Clarence E. Butler became dean of Hobart College in July 1998. Butler came to Hobart in 1979, after serving on the faculties at Brown University and Dartmouth College. He first was named assistant dean, then senior associate dean in 1983, after serving for two years as acting dean of the College.

Butler has served on many committees, including the Committee on Standards, Individual Major Committee, and President's Advisory Council. Aside from his administrative duties, Butler has taught German part time and, as an Episcopal priest, has at times served the local

community in that capacity as well.

Butler received bachelor's and doctoral degrees from Washington University in St. Louis, a master's from the University of Kansas, and a bachelor of divinity degree from the Episcopal Theological School. He also received a language diploma from the University of Stockholm in Sweden. He is a former Fulbright Scholar and DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Scholar.



HOBART DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MIKE HANNA '68

A 1968 graduate of Hobart, Mike Hanna became the College's athletics director in 1981. He has piloted the athletics program through unprecedented championships in lacrosse. His vision, along with that of his William Smith counterpart, led to the construction of the Robert A. Bristol '31 Field House in 1989 and the Dr. Frank P. Smith '36 Squash Center in 1998. Improvements in the new millennium under his tenure include the Bozzuto Boathouse, McCooey Field, Cozzens Field, the RFK Strength Training Center, the Topichak Team Rooms in the Elliott Varsity House, and the Tom Poole Team Room for Hobart Soccer.

As a quarterback, Hanna broke all of Hobart's season and career passing records during the 1966 and 1967 seasons. A second-team All-American lacrosse attackman in 1968, Hanna finished second for the Statesmen in scoring that year with 35 goals and 35 assists. He cocaptained both the football and lacrosse teams his senior year. In 1968, he was awarded the Francis L. "Babe" Kraus Award as Hobart's Athlete of the Year and the Judge Kane Award as MVP in lacrosse.


