Head Coach Rich Roche '87

The first coach to lead the Statesmen to the NCAA Basketball Championship Tournament, Rich Roche became the 15th man to lead the Hobart basketball program on Aug. 4, 1997. No stranger to the Hobart family, he was a four-year letterman and team captain for the Statesmen, garnering the Charles E. Love Memorial Award for scholarship, leadership, and all around value to his team.

After just five seasons, Roche ranks fourth on the school's career wins list and fifth on the winning percentage list, while boasting the highest wins per season of any Hobart basketball mentor. His progress with a program that featured just three winning seasons



between 1978-79 and 1996-97 has not gone unnoticed. He was named the 2001 Liberty League, RACA, NABC East Region, and BCANY Upstate Coach of the Year. Roche has mentored a finalist for the Jostens Trophy, presented to the Division III Player of the Year, four Regional All-Americans, three Liberty League Players of the Year, and a Liberty League Rookie of the Year.

His direction hit a high-water mark for the program during the 2000-01 campaign, breaking the school record for wins in a season with a 20-8 mark, including an 11-3 record in conference play. In the Liberty League Tournament, the Statesmen ran the table, claiming their first league title. The victory earned them a spot in the NCAA Tournament, while their record warranted a first round bye.

Roche returned to his alma mater from Saint Anthony's High School where he taught history for eight years and coached the basketball team for six seasons. During this time, Roche rebuilt a tradition rich program compiling an 80-64 record, produced 17 college players and reestablished the South Huntington, N.Y., school as a state Catholic power. In 1993, his Friars won the Long Island Catholic League Championship, and Roche received Coach of the Year honors. In 1997, St.



Anthony's made another trip to the league finals in a season that included a victory over national high school power Christ the King of New York City.

Roche earned a master's degree in education from Villanova University in 1994, and spent the 1993-94 season as an assistant coach to Steve Lappas. That season the Wildcats compiled a 20-12 record in winning the National Invitation Tournament championship at Madison Square Garden.

Prior to being named head coach at St. Anthony's, Roche spent single season stints as an assistant coach at SUNY-Farmingdale and New York Institute of Technology.

A native of Oceanside, N.Y., Roche and his wife, Melissa, reside in Geneva with their daughter, Hannah.

Assistant Coaches



Assistant Coach Joe Wojtylko

Joe Wojtylko returns for his third season on the Hobart coaching staff. He assists coach Roche with recruiting, scouting, and working with the big men during practice.

A native of Ocala, Fla., Wojtylko is a 2000 graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College, where he earned bachelor's degrees in history and philosophy. Wojtylko was the Bobcats Most Valuable Defensive Player for the 1998-99 campaign.

Following graduation, Wojtylko put on the coaching hat for the Bobcats, helping the team to its most successful season in 10 years. As the assistant, he coordinated all aspects of recruiting and supervised team academic affairs. He also put together a strength and conditioning program for the players.



Assistant Coach Dennis Pysnack

Dennis Pysnack is in his 16th season as an assistant coach in the Hobart basketball program. He plays an integral roll in scouting and local recruiting, as well as practice on a daily basis.

Pysnack, who joined the Hobart staff one year after coach Roche graduated, provides the program with stability and continuity. A gifted clinician, Pysnack has been active in the area junior leagues for several years. A native of Seneca Falls, N.Y., he recently celebrated the arrival of twins Ella and Jaymon.



Assistant Coach Carl Wenzel

Now in his fourth season with the Statesmen, Carl Wenzel has more than 30 years of coaching experience.

A teacher in the Geneva City School District since 1975, Wenzel coached the boy's junior varsity basketball team from 1975 through 1979. For the next 21 seasons, he guided the Panther's varsity team to a 265-182 (.593) record. Under his leadership, Geneva won three consecutive Finger Lakes East Championships (1982-84). A two-time Section V Class AA Coach of the Year,

Wenzel led the Panthers to Sectional Championships in 1989 and 1999.

A 1974 graduate of St. John Fisher College, Wenzel started three seasons for the Cardinals and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He and his wife, Ann, and their three children live in Geneva.



Student Assistant Coach Woody Kampmann

Woody Kampmann is in his first season on the Hobart coaching staff. A native of Pacific Palisades, Calif., Kampmann is on schedule to graduate from Hobart in May 2005 with a bachelor's degree in American studies. He played last year for the Statesmen after transferring from Colby College.

Kampmann will assist Coach Roche with academic affairs, film exchange, scouting, and will work with the guards during practice.

Season Outlook

The Hobart Statesmen begin the 2004-05 season with high expectations thanks to a solid core of returning veterans, a pair of backcourt transfers, and a talented crop of first-year forwards. Eighth-year Head Coach **RICH ROCHE '87** is excited about the potential of this year's squad.

"Last season, we weren't able to go very deep into our bench, but with the players we've added to the roster this year, along with the guys coming back, our depth will be a strength this season," Roche says. "If anything, we may have trouble finding enough minutes for everyone."

Hobart welcomes back five players that started at least 11 games in 2003-04, including two of the top five returning rebounders in the Liberty League, senior forward **JOE FLACKE** and junior forward **TIM APUZZO**.

The team's leading scorer and No. 2 rebounder, Flacke averaged 12.2 ppg and 7.0 rpg during his first season in the starting lineup. Focused on making his final season his best, he worked diligently in the weight room during the offseason, adding 15 pounds of muscle to his 6-foot-7 frame. A seemingly unstoppable force in the paint when he's on—he had 15 double digit scoring nights, including six games of 20-plus—the coaching staff is looking for more consistent game-to-game production from Flacke.

The No. 2 returning scorer and the top rebounder, Apuzzo also made an impressive showing in his first season as a starter. The native of Cumberland, Maine, averaged 9.9 ppg and 7.3 rpg along with a team best 21 blocked shots. While Flacke has a shooter's touch to 15 feet, Apuzzo owns the paint and dares opponents to step inside.



The backcourt tandem of sophomore **MIKE MANNING** and junior **COLBY FEANE** also is expected to return to the starting lineup.

Manning made a splash in his first season with the Statesmen, averaging 9.6 ppg, 3.0 rpg, and 1.2 spg. A gifted athlete, he broke into the starting lineup by midseason and feasted on Union in conference play, dropping 39 points in two games on the Dutchmen.

Returning for his third season as the starting point guard, Feane has shown steady improvement and is poised to have a breakthrough season. He averaged 9.6 ppg, 3.8 apg, and 1.3 steals last season, including a 26-point effort

In 2003-04, Tim Apuzzo averaged 9.9 ppg and 7.3 rpg. He won the Kent Butler Award as the team's most improved player.

at Clarkson and a nine-assist night against St. Lawrence. A two-sport athlete, Feane will shed his football shoulder pads as soon as the Statesmen's NCAA Tournament run comes to a close.

In the meantime, junior transfer **JOE VIRGILIO** is expected to run the point. A deft passer and a threat from three-point range, he helped the Bryant Bulldogs reach the NCAA Division II Tournament round of 16.

The team's other transfer, junior **ADAM FREDERIC** from Division II St. Andrew's, is penciled in at swingman. The 6-foot-4, 190-pound Frederic's playing style is very similar to Manning's. He can beat his opponent off the dribble or just shoot over him.

Depth, or lack thereof, was a curse for last season's Statesmen, but should be a good luck charm this year.



Colby Feane will join the basketball team as soon as Hobart's run ends in the NCAA Football Playoffs.

Sophomores **MIKE MASTRO** and **DAN MATUZAK** will spell Apuzzo and Flacke. Mastro played in 23 games as a first-year, contributing 3.3 ppg and 3.0 rpg, while Matuzak, a reserve quarterback on Hobart's football team, made slower progression because of an extended season on the gridiron.

First-year forwards ROB GENOVESE (6-foot-4, 180), JOHN GRAZIOLI (6-foot-6, 210), and DAN O'GRADY (6-foot-6, 200) all could see meaningful minutes this season as well.

The backcourt depth may be even more impressive than that of the frontcourt. Seniors **ERIC JACKS** and **ZACK STELZNER** will battle for time at the point and shooting guards respectively. Jacks possesses excellent court vision (2.9 assist-to-turnover in 2003-04), while Stelzner is a tenacious defender (27 steals in 21 games). Jacks and Stelzner have 16 career starts between them and shouldn't be counted out of earning a spot in the first five.

With depth and talent returning everywhere on the court, the Statesmen anticipate being in the thick of the race for a spot in the Liberty League Championship Tournament. Hobart will warm up with a challenging non-conference schedule that includes three 2004 NCAA Tournament teams, Rochester and St. John Fisher, and perennial Southern powerhouse Roanoke.

Once the Statesmen dive into the conference fray in January, things don't get any easier. In addition to Hamilton, an NCAA Tournament team, Hobart will square off with ECAC Tournament teams Clarkson, Rensselaer, Skidmore, and Union.

"Is this team good enough to win the conference? I think it's too early to tell," Roche says. "But when February rolls around, I expect we'll be in the hunt. If we make it that far, then a trip to the NCAA Tournament is just a good weekend away."



Hobart and William Smith Colleges are private, coordinate, liberal-arts colleges in Geneva, N.Y. Hobart College was founded in 1822, William Smith College in 1908. Hobart enrolls 835 men and William Smith 1,005 women. The full-time equivalent teaching faculty numbers 174 members, 98 percent of whom hold doctoral degrees.

The two colleges have the same faculty; men and women students attend classes together and use the same library and laboratories. Each college, however, awards its own degrees, has its own dean and admissions office, and maintains its own student government and athletics programs.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

At the Colleges, the academic year is divided into two 15-week semesters. Students take four courses each term, eight per year, for either a bachelor of arts or bachelor of science degree. The academic program traditionally comprises four years.

Majors are available in American studies, anthropology, art, biology, biochemistry, chemistry, classics, comparative literature, computer science, economics, English, geoscience, Greek, history, Latin, mathematics, modern languages (French and Spanish), music, philosophy, physics, political science, psychology, religious studies and sociology.

Individual majors may be developed in Asian studies, Africana/Latino studies, urban studies and women's studies, among others. In addition, the Colleges offer a master's degree in education.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Hobart College Department of Athletics believes that intercollegiate athletics play a major role in the educational process, and strives to provide a challenging, meaningful and exciting experience for student-athletes. Hobart is a member of the Liberty League, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), and Divisions III and I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

A native of Gardner, Mass., President Gearan earned a bachelor's degree in government cum laude at Harvard University and a law degree from Georgetown University. He is also the recipient of several honorary degrees. President Gearan was confirmed by the U.S. Senate to serve on the board of the Corporation for National and Community Service, and was appointed to the national board of The Partnership of Public Service. He also serves as chairman of the National Campus Compact.



Dean of Hobart Clarence E. Butler Clarence E. Butler became dean of Hobart College in July 1998. Butler came to Hobart in 1979, after serving on the faculties at Brown University

and Dartmouth College. He first was named assistant dean, then senior associate dean in 1983, after serving for two years as acting dean of the College.

Butler has served on many committees, including the Committee on Standards, Individual Major Committee, and President's Advisory Council. Aside from his administrative duties, Butler has taught German part time and, as an Episcopal priest, has at times served the local community in that capacity as well.

Butler received bachelor's and doctoral degrees from Washington University in St. Louis, a master's from the University of Kansas, and a bachelor of divinity degree from the Episcopal Theological School. He also received a language diploma from the University of Stockholm in Sweden. He is a former Fulbright Scholar and DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Scholar.



Hobart Director of Athletics Michael J. Hanna '68

A 1968 graduate of Hobart, Mike Hanna became the College's athletics director in 1981. He has piloted the athletics program through unprecedented championships in lacrosse to today's department-wide success.

Hanna's vision, along with that of his William Smith counterpart, led to the construction of the Robert A. Bristol '31 Field House in 1989 and the Dr. Frank P. Smith '36 Squash Center in 1998. Improvements in the new millennium under his tenure include the Bozzuto Boathouse, McCooey Field, Cozzens Field, the RFK Strength Training Center, the Topichak Team Rooms in the Elliott

Varsity House, the Tom Poole Team Room for Hobart Soccer, and the Bob Ford Team Room for basketball.

As a quarterback, Hanna broke all of Hobart's season and career passing records during the 1966 and 1967 seasons. A second-team All-American lacrosse attackman in 1968, Hanna finished second for the Statesmen in scoring that year with 35 goals and 35 assists. He co-captained both the football and lacrosse teams his senior year.
