



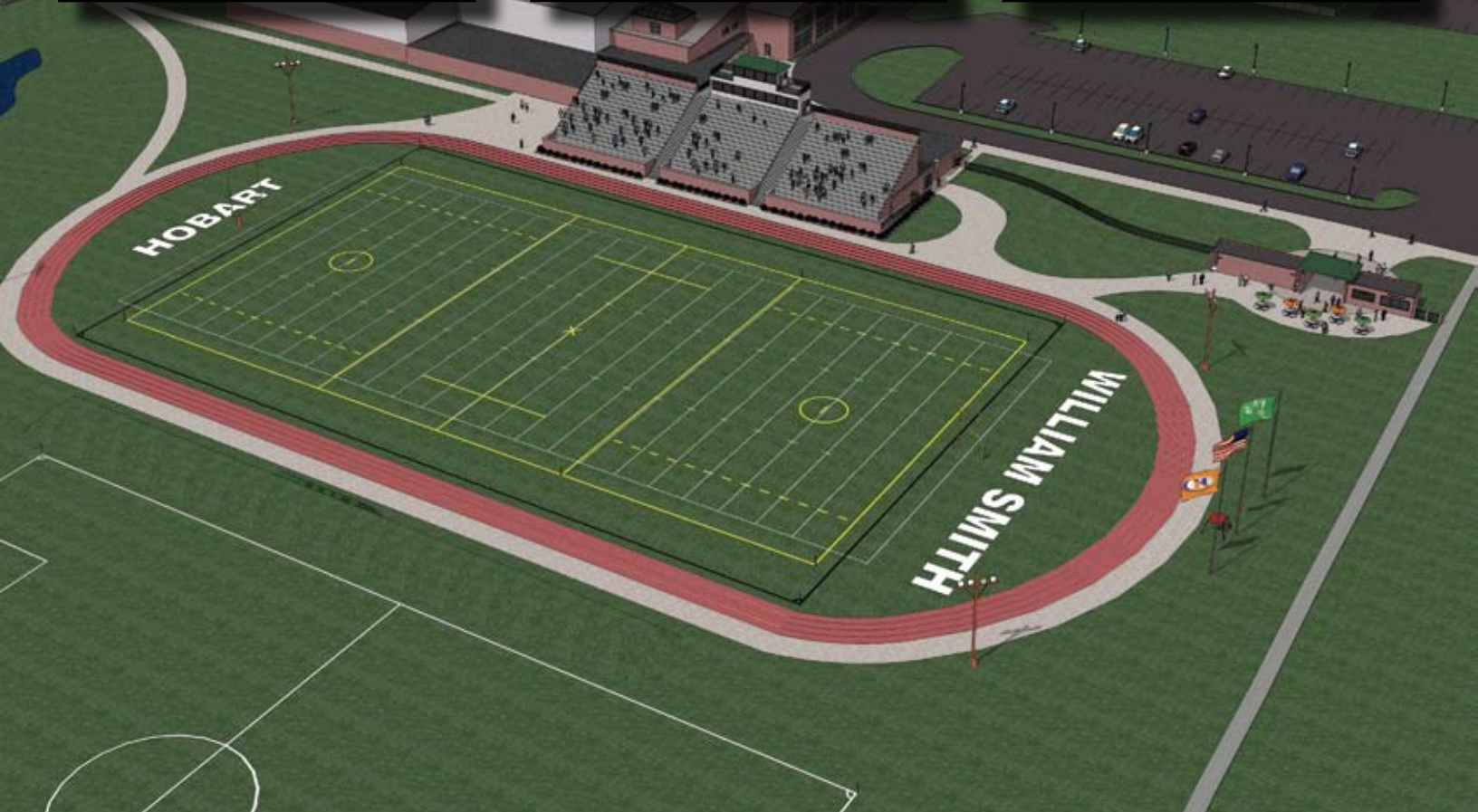

Athletic Facilities

Hobart & William Smith feature some of the finest athletic facilities in the nation. The Hobart football team plays its home games on the natural grass of legendary Boswell Field. The team has several practice fields, including the full-length indoor Bristol Field House. The Statesmen prepare for games and practices in the Topichak Team Room. Student-athletes also have exclusive access to the RFK Varsity Strength Training Center, the Drury Athletic Suite, the Piltch '82 and Feldman Classroom, and the Collins Editing Room.

Boswell Field and the adjacent Sport and Recreation Center are slated to undergo exciting renovations as a part of The Campaign for the Colleges. The grass of the Boz will be replaced with an artificial surface, all of the venue's seating and the track will be replaced and lights will be added for night games. Additionally, the locker rooms space will be expanded and existing locker rooms refurbished.

Slippery Rock University, B.S., 1983

Mike Cragg begins his 14th season at the helm of the Hobart football program with an exceptional list of career accomplishments. He has led the Statesmen to more wins than any of his predecessors and to all seven of the program's postseason appearances, including four straight NCAA bids.

Cragg, who also serves as Hobart's special teams coordinator, boasts an impressive 89-42 career record (.679) and a school record 11 consecutive winning seasons. He has guided Hobart to the top of the Liberty League seven times, reaching the conference's summit in five of the past six seasons.

In 2007, Hobart notched an 8-3 overall record and tied for the Liberty League lead. The Statesmen dominated the conference's postseason awards, earning the Offensive (QB Andrew Strom '08), Defensive (CB James Alexander '08), and Special Teams (P/K Dominick Ancona '08) player of the year awards and 18 spots on the All-Liberty League teams.

Hobart ranked in the top 25 in the nation in turnovers lost (1st), passes had intercepted (2nd), fumbles lost (5th), passing efficiency (7th), turnover margin (9th), pass efficiency defense (15th), kickoff return defense (19th), scoring offense (24th), and total offense (25th).

In 2005, the Statesmen posted a 9-2 record. The nine wins matched the program record for wins in a season established by Hobart's 1896 and 2004 squads. The '05 Statesmen led the Liberty League in turnover margin, scoring defense, rushing defense, punt returns, pass efficiency, and pass efficiency defense. Cragg's charges cleaned up in the postseason accolades, collecting 14 All-Liberty League honors and the Defensive Player of the Year Award (Tony Clemente '06).

Cragg, who served as the team's defensive coordinator from 1991 to 2006, directed the 2000 Statesmen into the NCAA records book. The Hobart secondary, aided by a relentless pass rush, broke the NCAA Division III record for lowest pass completion percentage allowed. Hobart opponents were successful on just 31.3 percent (79-of-252) of their pass attempts, eclipsing the old mark, 33.5, set by Plymouth State in 1987. At the close of the regular season, Cragg's defense ranked first in the nation in pass efficiency defense, sixth in scoring defense, eighth in turnover margin, and 12th in total defense.

Cragg has mentored several All-Americans, including consensus All-Americans Dave Russell '98 and Alex Bell '05. Several Statesmen have gone on to play football professionally, including Bell who signed with the New York Giants as a free agent.

In addition to the team's on-field success, Cragg's Statesmen have received a great deal of recognition for their efforts in the classroom. During his tenure, four Hobart players have been named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America teams, while dozens of Statesmen have earned Liberty League All-Academic accolades.

Named the 23rd head coach of the Hobart football program in January 1995, Cragg is one of the veteran members of the Statesmen family, joining the football staff in 1986. He also served as the head coach of the tennis team for three seasons, compiling an overall record of 36-10 and three conference championships.

Cragg came to Hobart after serving as the head coach of the varsity football program at Corry High School in Corry, Pa. He led Corry to a third-place finish in the Erie County League in his first year, a first-ever appearance in the District X Playoffs in 1986, and was named Coach of the Year.

A 1983 graduate of Slippery Rock University with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education, Cragg was a two-year letterwinner for the Rock at free safety and linebacker. He still owns a share of the school's single game interception record (3 vs. Edinboro, 1980). His senior season was short-circuited by a knee injury, so he got an early jump on his coaching career, assisting the Slippery Rock staff with the defensive backs.

Cragg and his wife, Holley, live in Geneva with their two children, Michael and Kristen Alexandria.

Offensive Coordinator
Offensive Line Coach

Now in his ninth season on the Hobart sideline, Kevin DeWall is entering his sixth season as the offensive coordinator. Traditionally a program that relied on its defense, he transformed Hobart into a consistent offensive weapon.

Over the past five seasons, DeWall has directed the Statesmen offense to new heights, surpassing several team and individual records. His balanced attack has produced several record-setting quarterbacks, running backs, and wide receivers, along with several all-star linemen, including All-American Alex Bell '05.

Last season, DeWall's charges led the nation in fewest turnovers lost and paced the Liberty League in 22 statistical categories, while breaking several team records. Quarterback Andrew Strom '08 joined Craig Swanson '04 as Statesmen who've earned the Liberty League Offensive Player of the Year award under DeWall's tutelage.

A 2008 inductee into the Waterloo Athletic Hall of Fame, DeWall coached the defensive backs in his first three seasons on the Hobart staff.

While earning a bachelor's degree in biology (pre-med) and education, DeWall played free safety and aided the program's ascent toward the pinnacle of Division III. Also an attackman on Hobart's Division I lacrosse team, he helped the Statesmen to two NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2000 Patriot League title. DeWall was the 2000 Patriot League Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was named to the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District Team.



Scott Yoder '01
Defensive Coordinator
Defensive Backs Coach

Scott Yoder is back for his eighth season as an assistant coach and his second as defensive coordinator. The 2001 graduate of Hobart has previously coached Hobart's defensive backs and receivers.

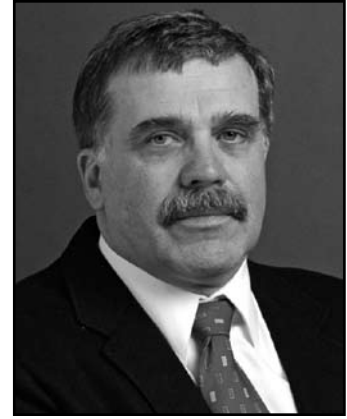
Last season, Yoder's defense led the Liberty League in passing defense (158.6 yds/g), pass efficiency defense (92.4), and interceptions (17). Led by Liberty League Defensive Player of the Year, cornerback James Alexander '08, the Statesmen had six defensive players earn all-conference honors.

In 2004, Yoder mentored a talented and deep corps of receivers, including two All-Liberty League selections. Under his direction, Dan Suozzi '05 broke the Hobart career records for receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns.

A reliable target himself, Yoder finished his career with 108 receptions for 1,361 yards. Following the 2000 season, he earned first-team accolades from the ECAC and the Liberty League.

The economics major was also a member of the Division I Hobart lacrosse team. Yoder helped guide the Statesmen to the 2000 Patriot League Championship and the program's 23rd NCAA postseason appearance.

Yoder lives in Geneva with his wife, Alyson WS'03.



John Manley
Running Backs Coach

John Manley enters his ninth season as running backs coach. He joined the Statesmen after 14 seasons as the head football coach at Penn Yan Academy.

In each of the eight previous seasons, Manley has overseen the development of an All-Liberty League running back. Last season, Anthony Hobaica averaged a team best 4.1 yards per carry, earning a spot on the all-conference second team.

In 2005, Doug Blakowski '07 became just the third Statesman to rush for more than 1,300 yards in a season. His 1,364 yards on the ground rank third on the single season list, while his 5.8 yards per carry led the Liberty League. A year later, Blakowski ran for 1,084 yards and 14 touchdowns. Manley's apprentice ranked in the top 25 in the nation in scoring in each season.

At Penn Yan Academy, Manley guided the Mustangs to 13 Section V tournament appearances, including back-to-back championship game appearances in 1994 and 1995. A physical education instructor in the Penn Yan School System since 1973, he has coached the Eddie Meath All-Star Football Game three times.

Accomplished and multifaceted, Manley has coached basketball, baseball, hockey, lacrosse, track, and softball.

Manley graduated from SUNY-Brockport with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He lives with his wife, Rita, and their four children in Keuka Park.





Terry Muffley

Defensive Line Coach

Terry Muffley is entering his 10th season as Hobart's defensive line coach and his seventh as a volunteer assistant coach for the lacrosse team.

On the gridiron, he has overseen the development of 17 all-conference linemen. Last season, Muffley mentored All-Liberty League picks Ryan Aruck, Jim Drury, and Kwame Lovell, who combined for 138 tackles and 11 sacks.

In the spring, Muffley joins Hobart's lacrosse coaching staff, working primarily with the faceoff specialists.

A former scholastic coach, Muffley was a fixture on the Geneva High School sidelines for more than two decades, assisting the Panthers' football team to two league titles and the lacrosse team to three Section V crowns.

Muffley earned a bachelor's degree from East Stroudsburg University.

A veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps with service in Vietnam, Muffley lives in Geneva with his wife, Cindy. They have two grown children, Patrick and Bess.



Aaron Backhaus '00

Linebackers Coach

Aaron Backhaus returns for his fifth season on the Hobart sidelines as the linebackers coach.

During his four previous seasons, 12 of his Statesmen have earned All-Liberty League recognition, including 2005 Defensive Player of the Year Tony Clemente.

Last season, Backhaus mentored Justin Hager to the finest season by a Statesmen in over a decade. The junior finished with a League high 114 tackles. Hager twice tied the team record for tackles in a game last season, recording 19 stops against Carnegie Mellon and Rochester.

As a player, Backhaus was a four-year starter at inside linebacker. The four-time All-Liberty League pick left the gridiron with 279 career tackles and six interceptions. He led the Statesmen with a career-high 98 tackles as a first-year.

After earning a bachelor's degree from Hobart in psychology in 2000, Backhaus went on to complete a master's degree in education at Alfred University.

In addition to his coaching duties, Backhaus is a counselor at the Geneva Middle School and coaches track and field. He and his wife, Nicole, live in Geneva.



Jon Drach

Quarterbacks Coach

Jon Drach joined the Hobart coaching staff in April 2007. The former Western Michigan University starting quarterback mentors the Statesmen signal callers.

Last season, Drach coached Liberty League Offensive Player of the Year Andrew Strom, helping him break several Hobart season records, including the marks for passing yards, completion percentage, and pass efficiency.

A native of St. Charles, Ill., Drach was a member of the 2000 Broncos squad that won the West Division of the Mid-American Conference. A three-year starter, he enjoyed his finest season as a senior, completing a single season record 67 percent of his passes for 1,499 yards and 13 TDs.

A 2004 graduate of Western Michigan with a bachelor's degree in business finance and economics, Drach earned a spot on the Dean's List six times, was a two-time MAC All-Academic Team selection, and received the Broncos' 2003 John Gill Scholar-Athlete Award.

Following graduation, Drach spent three years as a trader in the financial industry. He broke into coaching in 2006 as the offensive coordinator at West Aurora (Ill.) High School.



Jim Ryan

Receivers Coach

Jim Ryan is the newest member of the Hobart coaching staff. He will mentor the Statesmen receivers during his first season.

Ryan brings seven seasons of coaching experience to Hobart. He spent the past two seasons as the receivers coach at Morrisville State.

Ryan began his coaching career as an assistant at Cato-Meridian High School, working with the receivers, outside linebackers, and special teams in 2001.

Ryan spent the next three seasons coaching at Bishop Grimes High School. In addition to assisting with the varsity, he also served as the head coach of the Cobras' junior varsity and modified teams.

In 2000, Ryan graduated from St. John Fisher with a bachelor's degree in education.

A four-year member of the Cardinals' football team, Ryan started at wide receiver during his junior and senior seasons. In 1999, he was second on the team in receptions and third in receiving yards.

A graduate of nearby Victor High School, Ryan was a two-time Finger Lakes All-League selection in football.

In a preseason meeting with Hobart Head Coach Mike Cragg, one statement spoke volumes about how far the program has come and where they expect to go.

"To be able to sit here and say that our seniors [the Class of 2008] made the NCAA playoffs all four years, I can't tell you how proud that makes me," Cragg said. "They were a part of very good teams, they were very consistent. I shy away from saying we were great. If we were a great team, we would have gotten deeper in the playoffs."

In 101 seasons prior to Cragg's promotion to head coach, the Statesmen had never played a postseason game. Thanks to his tutelage, Hobart has earned seven postseason bids since 2000, including six trips to the NCAA Tournament. The Statesmen have posted 11 consecutive winning seasons, an unparalleled string of success in the history of Hobart football.

While the program's dramatic turnaround is impressive, the real excitement lies ahead. The Statesmen have come to expect success and demand more of themselves.

The 2007 season was no exception. Hobart got off to an ominous start, winning just once in the first three weeks. The Statesmen recovered from the slow start and rattled off seven consecutive wins, earning a share of their fifth Liberty League championship in the past six seasons and a spot in the NCAA field. In fact, Hobart is one of only two teams in the East Region to make the NAAs in each of the past four seasons.

That level of success was richly rewarded when the Liberty League's postseason awards were announced. The conference coaches voted quarterback Andrew Strom, cornerback James Alexander, and kicker Dominick

Ancona the League's Offensive, Defensive, and Special Teams Players of the Year, respectively. It's the first time that those three awards have all been sent to the same campus.

Strom was very consistent in '07,

ranking sixth in the nation in passing efficiency (a Hobart record 159.47) and leading the Liberty League in passing yards (2,742), passing touchdowns (27), completion percentage (65.1) and yards of total offense (3,171). Exceptionally smart with the football, the Californian threw just three interceptions in 332 attempts. No other passer in the League threw fewer interceptions, and none that threw at least 200 passes had less than eight picks.

Alexander made 57 tackles and led the conference with eight interceptions (one shy of the Hobart record) and 13 pass break ups. The leader of the Statesmen secondary was tabbed a third team All-American by D3football.com.

Ancona broke the Hobart records for PATs made (48) and points by a kicker (78) and led the conference in punting average (39.0 yds/p), field goals made (10), and points by a kicker. In fact, only two players (both running backs) in the entire conference

outscored Ancona.

In all, 17 Statesmen earned 18 All-Liberty League awards, including nine first team, three second team, and six honorable mention.

The bad news from all of this success? The Liberty League's reigning triumvirate as well as defensive end Jim Drury (All-Liberty League honorable mention), wide receivers Ryan LiDrazzah (first team) and James Wright (first team), and offensive tackle Phill Perkins (first team) will not be in the lineup in 2008.

The good news is 10 All-Liberty League picks return, five on offense and five on defense. Here's a position-by-position look at the Statesmen:

OFFENSIVE LINE

Hobart returns four starters, including three all-conference picks, to the offensive line. The experience and talent of the front five is only overshadowed by the unit's chemistry and cohesion. The Statesmen led the Liberty League in total offense (430.2 yds/g) and ranked second in sacks allowed per game and third in rushing (164.4 yds/g). Add to that a recruiting class that Offensive Coordinator Kevin DeWall calls, "talented and loaded with potential," and the O-line will be the strength and keystone of the offense.

Senior Mike Condon (6-foot-2, 270 lbs) and junior Angelo Catalano (6-3, 270) both started at right tackle in 2007. Condon, a three-year starter, missed the start of last season with a hand injury, opening the door for Catalano to gain starting experience. With the graduation of Perkins, the starter at left tackle, Condon and Catalano possess the experience and skill set to be the early favorites to start at the two tackles.

Juniors Brian Monaco (6-2, 280) and Andrew Miller (6-1, 245) are the incumbents at guard. On the right side, Monaco was a second team all-conference selection as a formidable run blocker. Miller is the unit's most intense player. His quickness and aggressiveness will be an asset, especially in the running game.

At center, Rick Riggi (6-5, 285) returns, but will have to hold off fast developing sophomore Sean Kluber (6-1, 255). In his first season as a starter, Riggi was a solid and steady presence in the middle of the line. Kluber enjoyed a great preseason in 2007, but lost the campaign due to injury and illness. He has the versatility to contribute at any spot on the line.

Several first-years, including Jarid Blades (6-3, 290), Anthony Coletta (6-4, 250), and Brendan Hatlee (6-4, 305), have the opportunity to work their way into the rotation depending on how quickly they learn the offense.

RUNNING BACK

Tailbacks senior Anthony Hobaica and sophomore Andrew Marlier will share the load in the ground game. Hobaica led the Statesmen's running back-by-committee attack with 605 yards (4.1 yds/att) and seven touchdowns last season. He's a very strong athlete who has a very good understanding of the offense. Marlier averaged 3.4 yards per carry as a first-year, finding the end zone six times. He broke away for Hobart's longest run last season, a 51-yard pickup at Susquehanna.

Sophomore Matt Howard (8 att, 20 yds) and first-years Dwayne Simon and Kyle Tritten could also earn carries based on how fast they learn the offense.

The fullback job is completely up for grabs. Senior Tony Siravo, sophomore Shlomo Gelernter, and first-years Richard Fletcher and Andrew Kuhn will compete for playing time. Although

lacking experience on offense, Siravo is a converted linebacker and possesses the only collegiate playing experience of the quartet.

TIGHT END

Senior tri-captain Matt Duliba began his Hobart career as a promising linebacker, but injuries and the coaches' desire to get him on the field prompted him to take his athleticism to the other side of the ball. Duliba spent his sophomore season as an understudy, moving into the starting lineup last year. He finished the year fourth on the team in receptions (26 for 254 yds) and scored a touchdown. Duliba's versatility and toughness has forced the coaches to find ways to keep him on the field and get him more involved.

When Hobart goes to a two tight end set, look for senior Mike Ehmke or junior David Degan to get the call. Ehmke, a former Statesmen basketball player, has natural instincts in the passing game, and has worked to add strength and improve his run blocking. Hobart's No. 2 tight end in 2007, Degan is a very smart player.

First-years Matt Bobal and Matt Marsh could work their way into the rotation.

WIDE RECEIVER

With the loss of LiDrazzah and Wright from the receiving corps, junior backups Tyler Vincent and Zach Schulz should step into the starting roles. They are tall targets—both stand 6-foot-2—with the ability to stretch the field. Vincent was third on the team with 27 receptions for 321 yards and four touchdowns in 2007. He caught at least one pass in every game last year and caught TD passes in each of the final three weeks of the regular season. Schulz, who also plays for the Hobart tennis team in the spring, caught 22 passes for 284 yards as the Statesmen's No. 4 receiver. He should build on that production as he gains more experience.

Following spring practice, converted quarterback P.J. Overdorf had worked

his way up to No. 3 on the depth chart, but an ankle injury over the summer could hamper his progress to start the season. At 6-foot-2, he's a big target with steady hands and understands the offensive schemes well thanks to his quarterback experience.

The remainder of the depth chart will be an open competition between several players. Senior Joe Cowan has the best understanding of the offense and good speed. Sophomores Chris Bramwell, Tim Finnerty, and Andy Schettine are short on experience (no career receptions), but long on talent and potential. A strong group of rookie receivers—junior Mike Lazore and first-years Sam Higgs, Pat Julian, Garth Muratori, and Lamar Rodriguez—could also work their way into the three- and four-receiver sets.

QUARTERBACK

The biggest question mark on offense is who will replace Strom? If this question sounds familiar, it should. It's the same one everyone asked before the start of the 2007 season following the graduation of record-setting QB Shawn Mizro '07. Strom executed the offense with surgical precision, boasting a League best 9.0 touchdown-to-interception ratio. The second-best ratio was 1.9. While the coaching staff

doesn't expect that kind of efficiency from his successor, the quarterback that shows the greatest ability to manage the offense and minimize turnovers should earn the starting nod.

The preseason goal for the coaching staff is to head into the season opener with a clear cut 1-2-3 at quarterback.

Senior captain Rich Doyle is the early favorite in the wide-open competition. He has a strong grasp of the offense and is ahead of where Strom was mentally in preparation for the season. Doyle has limited playing experience (11-7-0, 91 yds, TD), but he has a strong, accurate arm and is ideally suited to succeed in Hobart's balanced attack.

Sophomore Larry Gregorek and first-years Jamieson Crast and Doug Vella figure to be Doyle's chief rivals for playing time. All three possess the capability of earning the starting nod, so the coaching staff is excited to see what comes from the competition.

DEFENSIVE LINE

The strongest point of Hobart's defense lays in the depth and talent the Statesmen feature on the line. With three starters returning, Hobart's success against both the rush and the pass this season will be keyed by the push the Statesmen get in the trenches.

How deep and talented are the Statesmen? The coaches are considering playing senior, all-star tackle Ryan Aruck (59 tkls in '07) and junior tackle Mike Faracca (28 tkls) LESS this season. While it may initially seem like a demotion, the coaching staff believes they can get even better production from its starting tandem by keeping them fresher throughout games.

Juniors Mike Arduini and Anthony Shaw will be called on to spell the starters. They combined for just 17 tackles a year ago, but have made steady progress throughout their careers and are ready to play an expanded role this season. First-years Stephen Pooler and Dane Wilcoxon could also contribute.

On the edge, the Statesmen will need to replace Drury on the strong side, a role likely to fall to sophomore Kwame Lovell. The starter on the weak side last season, he produced 39 tackles, including a team-high seven for a loss, and shared team-high honors with four sacks.

The weak side job is likely to go to junior Tony Guidetti. He possesses one of the best work ethics on the team and should see his numbers rise (8 tkls, 1 sack in '07) as his playing time increases.

Sophomore Chris Luber figures to be Guidetti's primary challenger for the starting job. A year stronger and a

year more mature, Luber is expected to see more time this season. Classmate James Rayhill was used as a pass rush specialist as a first-year, collecting six tackles, four of which were sacks. He'll see even more time this year in passing situations.

The top prospect in the class of 2012 is Joe Yanaitis. He's a solid tackler out of nearby Churchville-Chili High School and could also earn time on special teams as a long or short snapper.

LINEBACKERS

Hobart's roster will feature four All-Liberty League linebackers: fifth-year senior Jeff Sanders, senior Justin Hager, junior Ryan Robinson, and sophomore Kyle O'Laughlin.

Sanders, a two-time all-star, missed nearly the entire 2007 season after suffering an injury in the opener at Dickinson. Now back at 100 percent, he's looking to close out his career with another all-star performance, adding to his 180 career tackles by manning the weak side inside linebacker slot.

Lindy's preseason All-American Justin Hager will patrol the strong side inside spot. He produced one of the most impressive seasons by a Statesmen defender in 2007, racking up a League-leading 114 tackles, third on Hobart's single season list. Hager had 11 or more tackles in six of 11 games, tying the single game record with 19 against Carnegie Mellon and Rochester.

Robinson is penciled in as a starter at outside linebacker. Last season, he was fourth on the team in tackles (50), tied for second in tackles for a loss (6), and also sported the second longest interception return for Hobart last season (28 yds against St. Lawrence).

Senior Orlando Patterson is expected start on the other side. He played in every game last season, recording 13 tackles and recovering two fumbles, while also contributing on special teams.

Junior Scott Holton will rotate in at outside linebacker. He's a very physical player, who came to Hobart as a free safety, but the coaches want to keep him closer to the line of scrimmage.

O'Laughlin is a Statesmen reserve, who could start for just about any other team in the league. He was sixth on the team in 2007 with 48 stops, including six tackles for a loss and 2.5 sacks.

O'Laughlin will see a good deal of playing time, interchangeably on both the strong and weak side. Junior Will Schweitzer and first-year Reggie Robinson will add depth in the middle.

Junior Scott Ghiraldi and first-years Drew Monroe and Dan Kolinski are the top prospects to add depth on the outside. Ghiraldi possesses a solid grasp of the defense, Monroe is a smart player, while Kolinski has very good speed and could be called on to blitz from the edge.

SECONDARY

The Statesmen allowed the fewest passing yards per game (158.6) and posted the lowest pass efficiency defense rating (92.4) in the Liberty League in 2007. In fact, Hobart ranked 15th in the nation in the latter category. While nearly half of the team's interceptions (8 of 17) graduated with Alexander, the Statesmen welcome back a talented secondary.

Senior free safety Lance Boyington will lead the secondary from his free safety position. He's a versatile athlete that makes very few mistakes. Expect Boyington to build on his 2007 success (32 tkls, 2 INT, 1 FF, 2 FR).

Junior corner Chris Szymanski, a starter in 2006, battled health problems last season, but is 100 percent and ready to fight for a starting nod. His experience (17 gms, 33 tkls, 5 PD) will be invaluable.

The other starting corner as well as depth in the secondary will come from a strong group of underclassmen.

At the corner, look for sophomore Kevin Grogan and first-years Bryan Hulser and Drake Woodard to fight for time on the field. Grogan is a converted wide receiver who adapted well to the defense during spring practice. Hulser is a solid cover corner, while Woodard might be one of the most athletic players on the team, forcing the coaches to work him into the lineup.

At free safety, Boyington's primary challengers will be sophomore John Kelliher and first-year Zach Jones.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Hobart enjoyed a strong 2007 on special teams. The Statesmen led the Liberty League in kickoff returns (20.1 yds/att) and PATs (92.3%), ranked second in kickoff return coverage (19th nationally, 14.9 yds/att), and third in field goals (71.4%), and punting (32.2 net yds/att).

The kicking game is totally up in the air with the graduation of Ancona. P.J. Overdorf, a quarterback turned wide receiver, is the only returning player with any kicking experience (1 punt for 37 yds). First-years Conor Callahan and Robert Roth will join the competition. The coaches expect to spread the kicking duties (kickoffs, short and long field goals, and punting) out among the three unless a dominant player emerges.

Hobart has traditionally trusted kickoff and punt return duties to younger players, eager for playing time and anxious to make a name for themselves. The one spot the coaching staff hopes to make big improvements to is punt returns, where the Statesmen ranked last in the league last season (5.9 yds/att). A first-year receiver or defensive back is expected to take on these duties.

SCHEDULE

Hobart opens its 115th season on Sept. 13, when the Dickinson Red Devils (9-2 in 2007) visit Boswell Field. Seven days later, the Statesmen will travel to Pittsburgh for another non-conference showdown with Carnegie Mellon (7-4).

The quest for the Liberty League title starts when the Susquehanna Crusaders (2-8) come to the Boz. The game will be televised on a tape delay basis on Time Warner Sports Network.

Hobart's longest active winning

streak will be on the line when the Statesmen head to Canton on Oct. 4. Hobart has won 16 in a row from the St. Lawrence Saints (4-5), a string of successes that began in 1992.

Hobart's only home game of October is on the 11th when the Union Dutchmen (5-5) come to town. Following a week off, the Statesmen head to Kings Point for a date with the Merchant Marine Mariners (1-9) on Oct. 25.

Nov. 1 will see the WPI Engineers take to Boswell Field looking for their first win against the Statesmen. Hobart has won the past four contests by an average of 12.3 points.

The Statesmen will look to avenge their only conference loss of 2007 when they head to Troy on Nov. 8 to take on Rensselaer. With a last minute touchdown, the Engineers pulled off a thrilling 35-31 win in Geneva last year.

The regular season culminates on Nov. 15, when Hobart hosts Rochester in the Centennial Cup game. The Statesmen are looking to even the series that began in 1892 (Rochester leads 47-46-7). The showdown with the Yellowjackets will also be the final contest on the natural grass of legendary Boswell Field.

Following the football season, extensive renovations will begin on the stadium. The facility is expected to include a new artificial surface, lighting, expanded locker rooms, and a new grand stand and press box.

DICKINSON 30, HOBART 27 (OT)

Hobart lost its season opener in heartbreaking fashion, falling to Dickinson 30-27 in overtime. The Statesmen were 4-0 in overtime entering the game.

The Statesmen grabbed the early lead when QB Andrew Strom drove his team down the field on the opening drive. Hobart covered 74 yards in 10 plays, capped by a 10-yard scoring run by Strom.

Making his first start for the Statesmen, Strom completed 22 of 26 passes for 192 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 34 yards and a TD. QB Rich Doyle also played, completing 5 of 9 for 63 yards. Together, they connected with nine different receivers, led by WR Ryan LiDrazzah's six catches for 44 yards and a touchdown.

The Red Devils got on the board thanks to a Hobart fumble at the Statesmen 13. Three plays later, the score was tied, 7-7.

Dickinson grabbed the lead with 2:38 remaining in the first quarter on a four-play, 87-yard drive. QB Ian Mitchell's 74-yard run set up a 12-yard TD. The extra-point was blocked leaving the Red Devils a 13-7 edge.

The second quarter belonged to Hobart as RB Andrew Marlier scored on a 1-yard touchdown run and Strom hit LiDrazzah for a 28-yard strike. Dominick Ancona's PATs found their mark sending the Statesmen into the break with a 21-13 lead.

Ancona accounted for the only points of the third quarter on a 41-yard field goal, the longest by a Hobart player since Sept. 24, 2005 (47 yds).

Late in the fourth quarter, Dickinson ended its nearly 45-minute scoring drought on an 8-yard touchdown run by Tim Smith (85 yds, 2 TD). The two-point conversion was no good, leaving Hobart a 24-19 lead.

Trailing by five with under a minute remaining, the Red Devils forced a fumble at their own 15. DB Will Scott scooped it up and returned it 86 yards for the go ahead TD with 47 seconds remaining. The two-point conversion put the Devils up 27-24.

From their own 18-yard line, Strom and Doyle completed a pair of passes each, moving the Statesmen into scoring range with one second remaining. Ancona's second career field goal attempt was true from 36 yards, forcing OT.

Hobart missed a 42-yard field goal attempt with the first series in OT and Dickinson's Matt Stark booted a 37-yard field goal to win it.

Defensively, Dickinson had five players record double digits in tackles, led by linebacker Eric Dube's 18 stops. LB Jeff Sanders paced the Statesmen with eight.

The Statesmen upset 22nd-ranked Carnegie Mellon, 27-26. The Tartans had a chance to take the lead with 1:32 remaining, but missed a two-point conversion.

QB Andrew Strom threw for 247 yards and three touchdowns, while rushing for a team-high 35 yards. WR James Wright was his top target, pulling in eight passes for 99 yards and two touchdowns.

Hobart posted its first lead of the game with 4:47 remaining when Strom completed an 11-play 63-yard drive with a toss to the back corner of the end zone that WR Ryan LiDrazzah collected. K Dominick Ancona's PAT put the Statesmen up 27-20.

Carnegie Mellon answered with an 11-play, 73-yard drive that ended with Travis Sivek barreling in from 1 yard out. The Tartans opted to go for two, but failed as the pass was bobbled until the intended receiver was out of bounds. CMU attempted an onside kick, but Wright recovered for Hobart.

The Statesmen ran all but nine ticks off the game clock and iced the victory on FS Dan Pembroke's first career interception as time expired.

The defensive star of the game for Hobart was LB Justin Hager. He produced a team-high 19 tackles, the most by a Statesman since the start of the 1999 season. CB James Alexander also reached double digits with 11 stops. CB Jon Scholl paced the Tartans with a game-high 20 stops.

CMU jumped out to a 13-0 lead. At the 4:07 mark of the first quarter, Sivek ran in from 3 yards out and Colin Marks booted the point after for a 7-0 lead.

The Tartans made it 13-0 with 5:35 left in the second quarter on a 1-yard dive by Sivek. Marks' PAT was wide, a result that had big repercussions later in the afternoon.

The second score lit a fire under the Hobart offense. The Statesmen answered with a six-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard pass from Strom to Wright. Strom accounted for a pair of 20-yard gains on the drive, one with his feet and one with his arm.

The defense forced CMU to punt with 56 seconds left in the first half and Strom completed five straight passes to set up Ancona's 40-yard field goal as time expired.

Ancona tied the game 20-all with the only points of the third quarter, a 29-yard field goal with 1:45 left in the frame.

The teams traded touchdowns to start the fourth quarter, CMU on a 14-yard run by Gimson and Hobart on a 13-yard twisting reception by Wright, to set up the drama of the final minutes.

Hobart rallied from a 21-7 fourth quarter deficit to take a 31-28 lead with 48 seconds remaining, but Rensselaer drove 67 yards in 35 seconds to score the game-winning touchdown with nine seconds remaining to steal a 35-31 Liberty League win. The Engineer victory snapped a five-game losing streak to the Statesmen.

After getting shutout in the second and third quarters, Hobart staged a furious fourth quarter comeback. RB Andrew Marlier recorded his second rushing touchdown of the day, less than two minutes into the final frame to get the Statesmen within seven, then the defense forced the Engineers to punt, setting Hobart up at its own 20.

On second and 10, QB Andrew Strom scrambled away from defensive pressure and found WR Ryan LiDrazzah wide open. He caught the pass near the Hobart 40, got two key down-field blocks from WR James Wright and WR Tyler Vincent, and outran the pursuit for an 80-yard touchdown that tied the game, 21-all.

Strom was 17-of-28 for 245 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. LiDrazzah was his top receiver with four catches for a game-high 114 yards. Wright had three catches for 63 yards.

RPI answered with a nine-play, 88-yard drive, capped by a 14-yard scramble by QB Jimmy Robertson, that put the Engineers back in front by seven.

Both offenses went three and out on their next possession. When RPI punted back to Hobart, the ball traveled just 15 yards, setting the Statesmen up with first and 10 from the RPI 33 and 2:27 to work with.

On the first play, RB Anthony Hobaica gained 15 yards and a first down. Hobart ran three times for a total of two yards to set up K Dominick Ancona's 33-yard field goal that put the Statesmen in front for the first and only time, 31-28, with 47 seconds left.

Hobaica was Hobart's leading rusher with 70 yards on 16 carries in his first collegiate start.

Robertson completed three straight passes to move RPI from its own 33 to the Hobart 3. All three completions ended up out of bounds stopping the clock. The last catch, by WR Chris Graef, was a fortunate carom that bounced off a teammate and a Hobart defender before Graef emerged from the fray with the ball. Two plays later, RB Isaac Williams barreled in from 1-yard out for the winning TD.

Defensively, Hobart LB Justin Hager logged a game-high 15 tackles.

Hobart rolled up 599 yards of total offense in a 41-13 Liberty League win at Susquehanna. QB Andrew Strom threw for a career-high 387 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Statesmen.

The Hobart defense turned in a stellar performance, forcing the Crusaders to punt on their first eight possessions. Susquehanna gained just three first downs and a scant 65 yards during the first half.

Meanwhile, the offense got on the board midway through the first quarter when Strom hit TE Matt Duliba on an 11-yard pass play. Hobart sent visiting Merchant Marine to its 13th consecutive loss with a 55-9 drubbing on Boswell Field. The Statesmen racked up 456 yards of offense, while limiting the Mariners to 116, including minus 18 in the first half.

WR James Wright caught five first half passes for 100 yards and two first quarter touchdowns to lead the way. He passed Nico Karagosian '97 to move into fourth place on the career receiving yards list with 1,682. Wright passed Luke Gutelius '98 and Scott Yoder '01 to move into fifth place on the career receptions list with 109. Wright also vaulted from sixth to fourth on the career touchdown receptions list with 15, passing Karagosian and teammate Ryan LiDrazzah.

LiDrazzah caught four passes for a game-high 105 yards. He passed Gutelius to move into ninth place on the career receiving yards list with 1,356. Senior quarterback Andrew Strom completed nine first half passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns.

Hobart won its fourth consecutive game, pounding Liberty League foe St. Lawrence 56-21. QB Andrew Strom threw for 262 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for game-high 74 yards and two more TDs to lead the Statesmen.

Hobart produced 506 yards of total offense, including a season-high 251 yards on the ground. The Statesmen dominated time of possession, holding on to the ball for 36 minutes, 16 seconds, while converting on 11 of 17 third downs.

For the second straight week, WRs Ryan LiDrazzah and James Wright both went over 100 yards receiving. LiDrazzah had seven catches for 107 yards and a TD, while Wright made five grabs for 101 yards and two TDs. K Dominick Ancona tied the single game record by making all eight PATs. He also averaged 46.7 yards punting, including a season-long 58 yarder.

Despite having minus seven yards of offense at the end of the first quarter, the Saints finished with 357 yards. QB Brad Heil threw for a game-high 294 yards and three touchdowns, but was intercepted twice. WR Mike O'Donnell produced game-highs with eight catches for 163 yards and two TDs.

LiDrazzah scored Hobart's first touchdown on the opening possession, a 13-yard out from Strom, capping a 12-play, 77-yard drive. The Statesmen defense forced SLU to punt, but the snap sailed over the punter's head and was covered at the Saints' 4-yard line. On the next snap, RB Don Gilardi scored the first of his two rushing touchdowns, sending the Statesmen into the second quarter with a 14-0 lead.

The Saints threatened to score with their first drive of the second frame, but CB James Alexander's interception in the end zone quelled the threat.

Hobart made it a 21-0 game late in the half, when Wright went 57 yards for a TD, capping a 10-play, 98-yard drive. The Statesmen squeezed in another long scoring drive before halftime, going 88 yards in 11 plays, this one finished off by an 18-yard bootleg by Strom.

While the first half was decidedly one-sided, the third quarter was a track meet with Hobart outscoring St. Lawrence 28-21 to complete the rout. Of the nine drives in the quarter, seven resulted in touchdowns. LB Ryan Robinson broke up one of the failed drives with his first career interception.

LB Justin Hager made a team-high six tackles for the Statesmen.

The win was the 16th in a row for Hobart in the series with St. Lawrence; all-time the Statesmen lead SLU 42-36-2.

Hobart upset No. 11 Alfred University 41-22 behind the record-breaking performances of QB Andrew Strom and K Dominick Ancona.

Strom threw for 229 yards and four touchdowns and rushed for 44 yards, raising his season yardage for total offense to 2,365, 91 more than Shawn Mizro's three-year-old record, while Ancona scored 10 points on two field goals and four PATs to raise his season total to 65, surpassing the 60-point standard established by Eric Ampuja '05.

The game got off to a dubious start for Hobart as RB Vinson Hendrix took the second play from scrimmage 46 yards for an Alfred TD. The PAT was wide right, leaving the Saxons a 6-0 lead.

Hobart's defense, led by the game-high 12 tackles of LB Justin Hager, stiffened and kept Alfred out of the scoring column for more than 25 minutes. The offense mean-

while put together scoring drives that resulted in a 35-yard Ancona field goal and a 29-yard TD reception by WR Ryan LiDrazzah to take a 10-6 second quarter lead.

The Saxons scored their second touchdown on an 11-play, 64-yard drive, 3:46 before the half, to take their final lead of the game, 13-10. Hobart did Alfred one better, marching 65 yards in 11 plays to reclaim the lead. Strom found LiDrazzah again, this time from 6 yards out for a 17-13 halftime edge.

While the first half was a tight, back-and-forth affair, that changed drastically after halftime. After forcing Hobart to turn the ball over on downs on the opening drive, Alfred used its first drive to notch a 25-yard field goal and make it a 17-16 game. The Statesmen countered with an 8-play, 61-yard drive that RB Don Gilardi ended with a 4-yard dive into the end zone. Ancona's PAT made it 24-16.

On the kickoff, the Statesmen called an on-side kick that caught the Saxons' flatfooted. Hobart recovered and scored another TD, this one a 15-yard completion from Strom to WR Tyler Vincent early in the fourth quarter. Alfred fumbled the ensuing kick return and Hobart recovered at the Alfred 7. Three plays later, Hobart settled for a field goal and a 34-16 advantage. Alfred's next drive ended on another fumble. The Statesmen used their fourth takeaway of the game to score yet another TD, but not before running 8:14 off the clock. WR James Wright caught a 24-yard strike from Strom to give Hobart a 41-16 lead with 2:48 remaining.

Alfred scored its only TD of the second half with just 1:15 left.

QB Andrew Strom threw for three touchdowns and 210 yards and the Hobart defense held Union to 89 yards rushing in a 30-20 victory.

Strom raised his season passing yards total to 2,260, eclipsing the three-year-old record set by Shawn Mizro '07 by 7 yards, while his three TD passes gives him 25 for the season, five shy of Mizro's 2004 mark.

RB Anthony Hobaica rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown for Hobart, while LB Justin Hager recorded a game-high 11 tackles, including two for a loss. LB Ryan Robinson had eight tackles, including two for a loss. TE Matt Duliba had six catches for 67 yards.

Hobart extended its winning streak to seven games with a 30-14 victory at the Rochester. The win gave the Statesmen a share of the Liberty League Championship. Rensselaer, a 20-14 winner over Union, earned the conference's NCAA automatic bid by virtue of the Engineers' win over the Statesmen.

Hobart's record-setting offense has drawn the big headlines this season, but it was the defense that was most impressive for the Statesmen on this day.

CB James Alexander recorded six tackles and a career-high three interceptions, while FS Lance Boyington registered five stops and two picks. LB Justin Hager matched his career-high with 19 tackles, while DT Ryan Aruck also reached double digits (10).

Alexander's first interception of the day led to Hobart's first touchdown. QB Andrew Strom capped a six-play, 45-yard drive with a 20-yard pass to WR James Wright for a 7-0 lead with 2:56 remaining in the first quarter.

Strom completed 20-of-31 passes for 284 yards and two touchdowns. In the process he broke Greg Helmer's 'single season mark for completions, raising the standard to 197.

Rochester pulled even with an 18-play, 69-yard drive that ran 9:30 off the game clock. RB Matt Bielecki (42 carries, 192 yards, 2 TDs) dove in from 1-yard out for the score with 3:17 left in the half.

Hobart responded with a pair of quick strikes before the break. RB Andrew Marlier's 1-yard plunge wrapped up a 4-play, 47-yard drive that took just 42 seconds.

Hobart sealed the victory with 10 fourth quarter points on a 33-yard K Dominick Ancona field goal and a 2-yard run by RB Anthony Hobaica (12 att., 50 yds).

Hobart lost in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to fifth-ranked St. John Fisher 24-7. The Cardinals improve to 10-1, while the Statesmen end the season at 8-3.

St. John Fisher outgained Hobart 389-299. The Cardinals bottled up the Statesmen running game, holding the visitors to just 101 yards. Hobart also struggled on third down, converting on just four of 14 tries.

The Statesmen won the opening coin toss and elected to receive. Hobart drove to the Fisher 10-yard line before sending the field goal unit onto the field. Dominick Ancona's 28-yard attempt missed wide left.

The Cardinals answered with a 13-play 75-yard drive that results in a 22-yard Chris Pierri field goal to give the home team the only points of the first half.

Hobart turned the ball over twice on downs and punted once, while St. John Fisher punted twice and turned the ball over on downs once heading into the intermission.

It was the first time the Statesmen were shutout in a half, since Hobart and Delaware Valley played a scoreless first half in the second round of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

The third quarter was a wild affair that saw both quarterbacks throw interceptions, while the Cardinals also lost a pair of fumbles.

Fisher fumbled away its opening drive. Hobart drove inside the Cardinals' 10, but QB Andrew Strom's pass attempt on second and goal was tipped at the line and intercepted.

LB Kyle O'Laughlin made sure the turnover didn't hurt the Statesmen, picking off QB Rob Kramer at the Hobart 9.

Four plays later, the Statesmen lined up in punt formation with Ancona's heels near the back of the end zone. Instead of punting though, Hobart put the ball in the hands of RB Andrew Marlier. The direct snap play gained 6 yards, but was well short of the first down.

The play proved to be the turning point in what had been a defensive battle. On second down, DE Jim Drury forced a Fisher fumble at the 8-yard line, but the Cardinals managed to recover at the 1. James Reile dove over the pile on the next play for the game's first touchdown. The extra point gave SJF a 10-0 lead with 3:54 left in the third quarter.

The Statesmen went three and out on their ensuing drive and Ancona's 45-yard punt was returned 77 yards to the Hobart 8. Two plays later, O'Laughlin caused another Fisher turnover, this time forcing a fumble that LB Ryan Robinson recovered.

Following another Hobart punt, the Cardinals put the ball in Reile's hands. He caught a first down pass for 19 yards and carried on four straight plays, the last a 2-yard touchdown. With the extra point, Fisher led 17-0 with 12:45 left in the contest.

Hobart answered with a 13-play, 72-yard march that Strom capped with a 5-yard run into the end zone. Ancona's extra point made the score 17-7 with 6:24 remaining.

Strom was 19-of-27 for 198 yards, while rushing for 36 yards. WR James Wright was his top target making five catches for 73 yards.

The defense forced the Cardinals to punt, but the kick took a funny hop and hit a Hobart blocker and was recovered by Fisher at the Statesmen 27. Fisher iced the victory four plays later when Reile scored from 14 yards out. He produced a game-high 112 yards rushing and three touchdowns.

The Hobart defense was led by LB Justin Hager's game-high 15 tackles, while Ryan Aruck was in on 12 stops, including one of four Hobart sacks. Hager's 114 tackles this season are the third most in Hobart history.

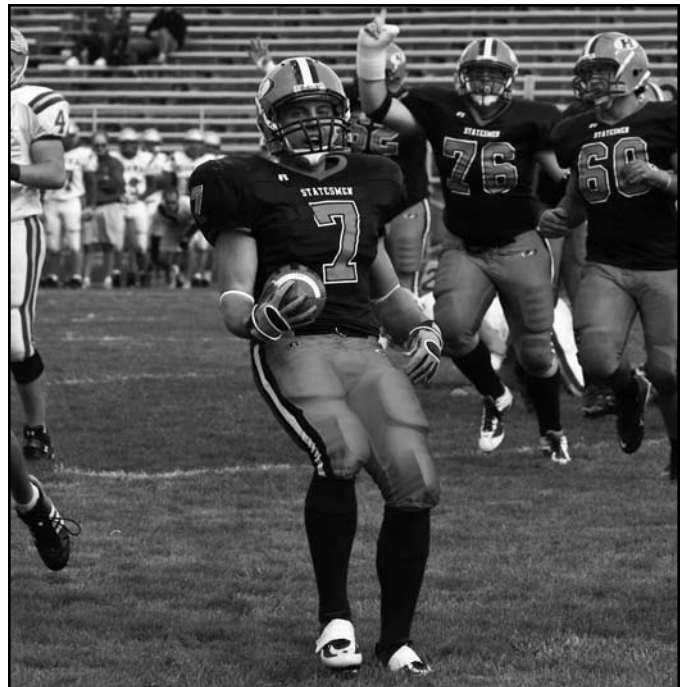

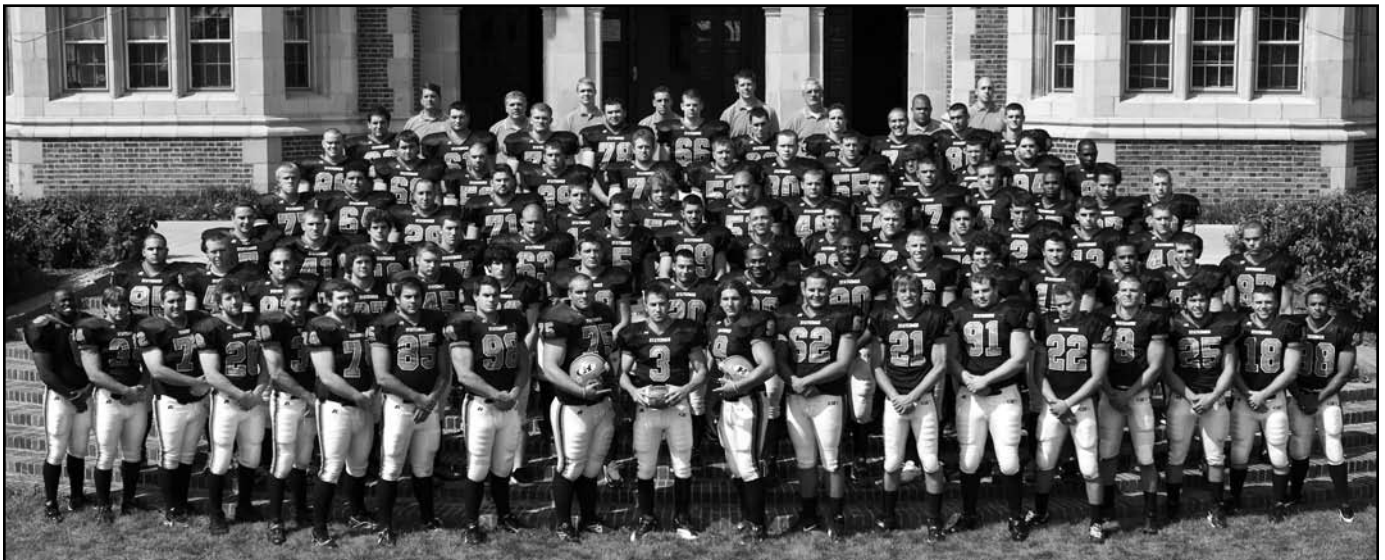

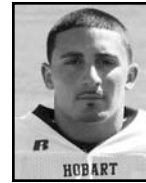

Originally founded as the Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association in 1995, the conference was renamed the Liberty League during the summer of 2004. The league includes founding members Clarkson University, Hamilton College, Hobart and William Smith Colleges, the University of Rochester, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, St. Lawrence University, Skidmore College, and Union College. Vassar College became a full member of the league during the 2000-01 academic year. The U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, and Worcester Polytechnic Institute joined the Liberty League during the 2004-05 academic year as associate members in football only. Susquehanna University is the newest associate member in football, beginning play in 2007-08.

The Liberty League sponsors championships in 24 sports. The member institutions of the league place the highest priority on the overall quality of the educational experience and on the successful completion of its student-athletes' academic programs. The member institutions seek to establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's athletic activities are conducted as an integral part of the educational experience.

During the 2007-08 academic year, the member institutions sent 20 teams in 12 sports to their respective NCAA Tournaments, as well as dozens of individual student-athletes to NCAA Championship events in cross country, golf, swimming and diving, tennis, and track & field.

Among the best in the nation in the classroom as well, Liberty League student-athletes garnered 10 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America awards and 54 Academic All-District honors.

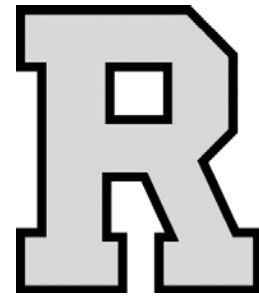

THE STATESMEN NICKNAME

Sports have been played at the College since the 1860s and for the first 70-plus years Hobart went without a moniker. Now Hobart College is blessed with an unusual and unique nickname, "The Statesmen."

The origin of Hobart's nickname came innocently enough. The football team was playing the opening game of the 1936 football season on Sept. 26, at Amherst College. The following day, *The New York Times* published a story describing the scoreless tie that occurred between the two teams. The article began:

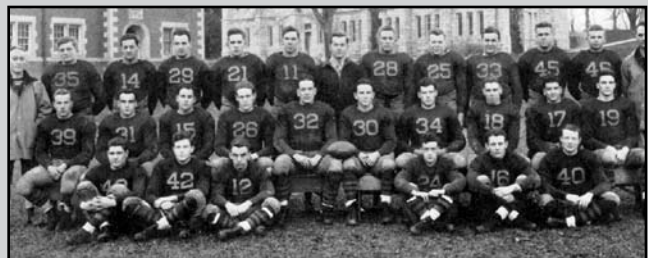
"In the Pratt Field opener today, Hobart and Amherst battled to a scoreless tie before a crowd of 3,000. The defensive play of both teams was superb. Hobart recorded eight first downs to Amherst's nine.

"The statesmen from Geneva received a lucky break in the first period when Wanzo fumbled and Benjamin recovered on Amherst's 40-yard line."

The author of the story referred to Hobart as the statesmen one final time, concluding the story with:

"Snowball and Pagnotta stood out for Amherst, while Bowling and Wright excelled for the statesmen."

And with those two references, Hobart College had a nickname.

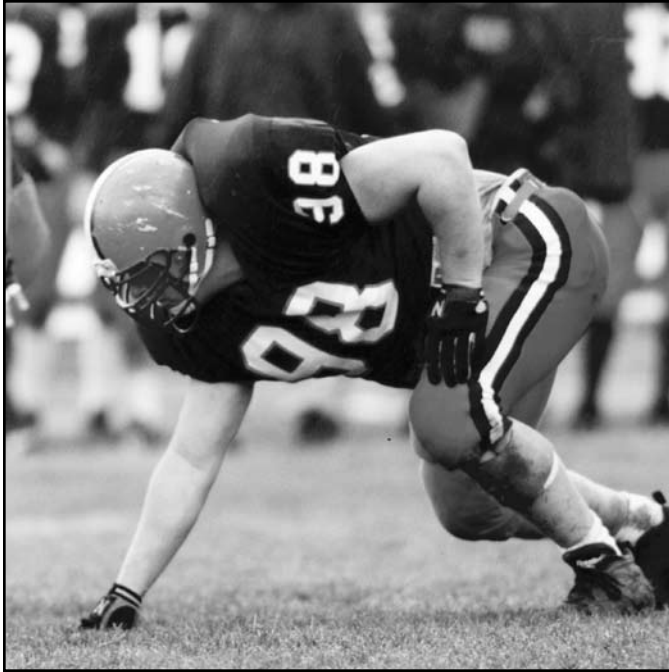

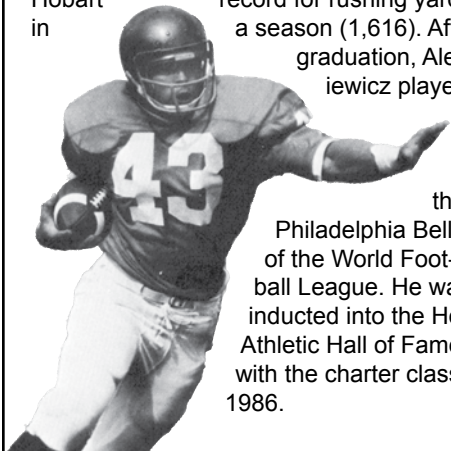

Rich Kowalski '76 was the second player in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. His career total of 4,632 yards, was an NCAA Division III record until 1985, and still stands as the Hobart standard, along with his career marks for points (308), carries (907), and total offense (4,760). The team MVP for three straight seasons, Kowalski won the Vincent Welch Trophy for scholarship and leadership in 1973, the Murray Bartlett Trophy for sportsmanship in 1975, and the Statesmen Trophy in 1976. He served as captain of the football team as a senior. Kowalski was inducted into the Hobart Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987.

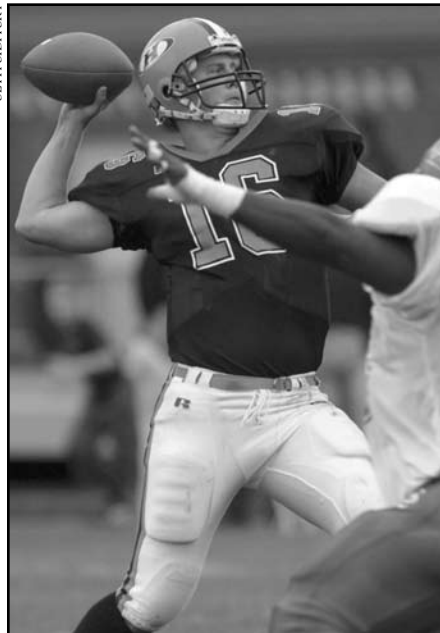

Hobart and William Smith are prestigious liberal arts colleges offering an array of imaginative, largely interdisciplinary degree programs to approximately 1,900 undergraduate students.

Small, residential, liberal arts colleges, Hobart and William Smith afford opportunities for rich one-to-one interaction with teaching faculty and instruction in small classes, as well as for robust academic choices. The Colleges' emphasis on interdisciplinary study imbues not only degree choices, but the construction of most individual classes.

In addition, Hobart and William Smith enjoy particular distinction in the areas of internationalism and public service. They offer a rich array of study-abroad programs and maintain a public service office which, working with the faculty, creates opportunities for co-curricular

volunteerism and helps integrate "service-learning" into the curriculum.

Hobart and William Smith are located in Geneva, N.Y., a community (population roughly 17,000) located in the heart of New York state's picturesque and historic Finger Lakes Region. The Colleges themselves sit on a spectacular 188-acre campus along the western shore of Seneca Lake. The William F. Scandling, one of only two research vessels owned and used by undergraduate institutions, allows students to use the lake as an area of study.

The dual identity of the Colleges—Hobart and William Smith—is a product of history. Hobart College was founded in 1822 by an Episcopal bishop as a college for men. (One notable exception was Elizabeth Blackwell, the nation's first female physician, who graduated in 1849 from

Mark D. Gearan, bringing extensive experience in public service and a strong commitment to undergraduate liberal arts education and international studies, became Hobart College's 26th president and the 15th president of William Smith College in August 1999.

Prior to being named to that position by the Colleges' trustees, Gearan was serving as director of the U.S. Peace Corps in Washington, D.C., a position he assumed in 1995. His resignation from that post to lead the Colleges garnered not only national headlines, but a flood of personal testimonials and tributes. President Bill Clinton, to whom Gearan reported as Peace Corps director, said, "Mark is gifted, humane, a leader, and deeply committed to the education of young people. I know that he will bring great vision to the Colleges as they enter the next century."

In his nine years at Hobart and William Smith, Gearan has created two master plans for the Colleges' future, HWS 2005 and HWS 2010; launched the \$160 million Campaign for the Colleges; and established the President's Forum Series, which brings national and international speakers to campus. Recently, he added his voice to the airwaves as host of the President's Radio Series and initiated a partnership with the greater Geneva community.

Gearan has extensive credentials in public policy and service including having served at the White House as Assistant to the President, Director of Communications, and Deputy Chief of Staff.

A native of Gardner, Mass., Gearan earned a bachelor's degree in government cum laude at Harvard University and a law degree from Georgetown University. He is the recipient of 12 honorary degrees.

He is married to Mary Herlihy Gearan, and they have two daughters, Madeleine and Kathleen.

A 1968 graduate of Hobart, Mike Hanna became the College's athletics director in 1981. He has piloted the athletics program to new heights through unprecedented championships in lacrosse, to today's department-wide success.

In an effort to enhance Hobart student-athletes' leadership skills both on and off the field, Hanna started the Napier Leadership Seminar. Initiated in 1996-97, participants meet throughout the year to discuss leadership issues and to learn from featured speakers such as University of Florida Director of Athletics Jeremy Foley '74 and New York Giants Vice President for Marketing Rusty Hawley '79.

During Hanna's tenure, he has overseen a wide-range of facility enhancements, including the building or remodeling of the Bristol Field House, the Smith Squash Center, McCooley Field, Cozzens Field, the Hockey Giants House, and the RFK Varsity Strength Training Center, as well as several team rooms.

An active member of the community, Hanna has served in a variety of civic positions. He continues to co-chair the Geneva Rotary Club's Student Loan Program and recently assisted Ontario ARC with their \$1.5 million capital campaign.

Hanna has been involved in college athletics, including stops at Johns Hopkins, Navy, and Princeton, since his discharge from the U.S. Army. He was a paratrooper and an officer in military intelligence, including a tour as an advisor in South Vietnam.

As a quarterback, Hanna broke all of Hobart's season and career passing records. He co-captained both the football and lacrosse teams and earned the Francis L. "Babe" Kraus Award as Hobart's Athlete of the Year during his senior year.

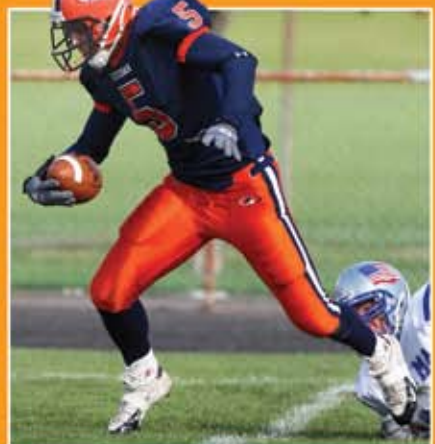
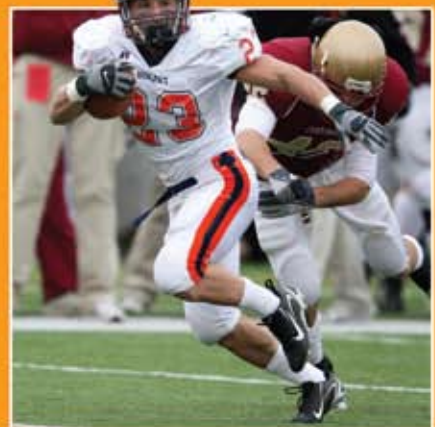
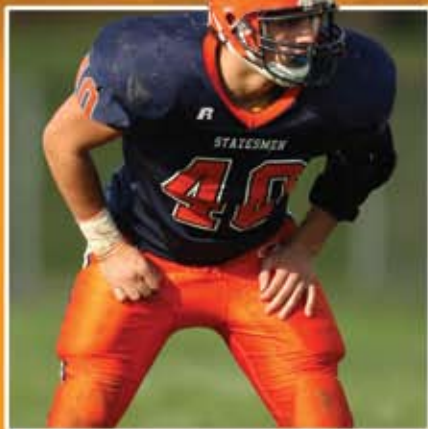
