SERIES SNAPSHOT—Today's game between the Statesmen and Dutchmen marks the 92nd meeting between the two schools with Union holding a 48-41-2 series lead. Hobart won the first showdown way back in 1896 by a score of 6-4. Over the past 10 seasons, the Statesmen hold a slim 6-4 edge, including last year's 30-20 triumph in Schenectady.

POINT-COUNTERPOINT—The all-time series score stands at 1,620-1,244 in favor of the Dutchmen. In fact, no team has scored more points against Hobart than Union. The Statesmen have scored more points against St. Lawrence (1,378), Rochester (1,363), and Alfred (1,285).

ABOUT LAST WEEK—Hobart relied heavily on its defense to defeat Liberty League rival St. Lawrence 16-10. Senior linebacker **JUSTIN HAGER** registered a game-high 13 tackles, while senior tackle **RYAN ARUCK** added 12 stops. First-year cornerback **DRAKE WOODARD** came away with two of the Statesmen's three interceptions. The offense overcame a 7-3 halftime deficit with 13 unanswered third quarter points to secure the victory. Sophomore running back **ANDREW MARLIER** averaged a game-high 5.8 yards per carry and scored on a 20-yard run to lead the offense.

THE STREAK—Including last Saturday's triumph, Hobart has won 17 consecutive games against St. Lawrence, the longest active winning streak by the Statesmen over a single opponent. Hobart's next longest streak against a current opponent is four straight wins over Merchant Marine, Rochester, and WPI.

MORE STREAKING—Hobart is off to a perfect 4-0 start, marking the fifth consecutive season the Statesmen have had a winning streak of at least four games. In fact, in each of the team's previous four seasons, Hobart has won at least seven games in a row. The program record for consecutive wins is 14, spanning the 1953, '54, and '55 seasons.

WHEN LAST WE MET—Nov. 3, 2007

SCHENECTADY, N.Y.—QB **ANDREW STROM** threw for three touchdowns and 210 yards and the Hobart defense held Union to 89 yards rushing in a 30-20 Liberty League victory at Frank Bailey Field. With the win, the Statesmen extend their winning streak to six games, while halting the Dutchmen's at five.

Strom raised his season passing yards total to 2,260, eclipsing the three-year-old record set by **SHAWN MIZRO '07** by 7 yards.

of the season's first four contests has been senior linebacker **JUSTIN HAGER**. In fact, he's led the Statesmen in tackles in nine consecutive games dating back to last season. Even more impressive, Hager has posted a game-high in tackles in eight straight games dating back to the 2007 campaign.

THIS JUST-IN—Speaking of **JUSTIN HAGER**, he leads the Liberty League and ranks third in the nation in tackles per game (13.75). Hager's on pace to log 124 tackles this season. That's 10 more than he recorded last season and only five shy of the season record set by **JESSE TRULEY '96** in 1995.

TOP PICK—Like his jersey number, **DRAKE WOODARD** is No. 1 in the nation in interceptions. He had an interception in the season opener against Dickinson, two the following week at Carnegie Mellon, and two more at St. Lawrence. Woodard's on pace for 11.25 picks which would break the Hobart season record (9) currently shared by **BILL PALMER '94** and **ERIC NEWSOME '01**.

ARMY OF ONE—If **DRAKE WOODARD** was a team in the Liberty League, he'd be second in the conference in interceptions with five. Rensselaer has 10 picks this season, three teams have five—Merchant Marine, Susquehanna, and WPI and all three have played five games already—Union has four, Rochester three, and St. Lawrence two.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM—One more note on **DRAKE WOODARD**, the native of Marcy, N.Y., has been named the Liberty League Rookie of the Week three times already this season. He drew conference praise following the Dickinson (4 tkl, INT), Carnegie Mellon (3 tkl, 2 INT, 1 PBU), and St. Lawrence (3 tkl, 2 INT, FF) games.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS—Senior **LANCE BOYINGTON** leads the conference and is 16th in the nation with a 14.0 yard per punt return average, while junior **ZACH SCHULZ** is third in the League and 28th in the nation at 12.0 per return.

BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION—Since 1985, 18 Statesmen have produced 200 or more career tackles. Seniors **JEFF SANDERS** (225), **RYAN ARUCK** (222), and **JUSTIN HAGER** (209) are the most recent additions to the exclusive club. This season marks the first time three Statesmen have reached this milestone in the same season. Five times previously, Hobart teammates have surpassed the 200-tackle mark, but never more than two in the same year.

AIR DEFENSE—The Statesmen lead the Liberty League in pass efficiency defense and pass defense. Opposing passers have an efficiency rating of 93.54, which puts the Hobart defense 30th in the nation. Opponents are averaging just 144.25 yards per game through the air, 37th in the nation.

LEAGUE LEADER—In addition to leading the conference in pass defense and pass efficiency defense, Hobart also sits atop the Liberty League in kickoff coverage (12.9 yds/ret allowed), punt return yards (220) and punt returns (17).

FOUR DOWN TERRITORY—On the other sideline, Union leads the Liberty League in fourth down conversion (87.5%). The Dutchmen have been successful on seven of their eight tries on fourth down this season.

BIG PLAYS—Hobart has averaged 5.5 "big plays" (20 yards or more) per game. Junior **ZACH SCHULZ** has been involved in a team-high six big plays. He boasts the team's two longest pass plays, catching a 38-yard toss from senior quarterback **RICH DOYLE** against Dickinson, and a 34-yard pass from Doyle for a TD at Carnegie Mellon. Schulz has also accounted for two of the team's three longest punt returns. Senior running back **ANTHONY HOBAICA**, senior tight end **MATT DULIBA**, junior wideout **TYLER VINCENT**, and sophomore running back **ANDREW MARLIER** each have three plays of 20 yards or more to their credit.

BALANCE IS THE KEY—Opposing defenses have little choice but to prepare for both the run and pass when facing Hobart. Of their 261 plays this season, the Statesmen have called 140 running plays and 121 passing plays.

PRESEASON HYPE—Senior linebacker **JUSTIN HAGER** was named a preseason second-

team All-American by *Lindy's College Football Preview*. In his first season as a starter, Hager turned in a record-setting 2007 campaign. The second team D3football.com All-East selection recorded a season-high 19 tackles against Carnegie Mellon and at Rochester. Posting 11 tackles or more in six of the Statesmen's 11 games, Hager finished the year with 114 stops, the third highest single season total in Hobart history.

STATESMEN SUSTAIN SUCCESS—Including last year's 8-3 mark, the Hobart football team has posted 11 consecutive winning seasons, a program record. Prior to the current streak of sustained success, the benchmark for winning campaigns was eight, established by the Hobart teams of 1921 through 1928.

CONFERENCE CROWNS—Hobart earned a share of the 2007 Liberty League Championship thanks to the Statesmen's 30-14 win over Rochester, finishing with a 6-1 conference record. It's the seventh time since 1998 that Hobart has captured at least a share of the league title.

SECOND CENTURY—Now in their 115th varsity season, the Statesmen have made seven postseason appearances over the past eight seasons (6 NCAA bids, 1 ECAC Bowl). That's an impressive turnaround after earning just a single postseason invitation—an ECAC bowl bid that was turned down—in the program's first 100 seasons.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A CENTURY MAKES—During the 20th century, Hobart football was 351-405-32 (.466). But since the turn of the century, the Statesmen are one of the winningest football teams in Division III. Hobart is 58-18 in the 21st century for a winning percentage of .763, the best among New York State schools and 20th in the nation.

HE'S THE BOSS—Now in his 14th season, Head Coach **MIKE CRAGG** boasts a career record of 93-42. He has been named the Liberty League Coach of the Year four times and was the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2002. Cragg is Hobart's all-time leader in wins and games coached (135) and is second in winning percentage (.689).

LENDING A HAND—Head Coach **MIKE CRAGG** is assisted by Offensive Coordinator **KEVIN DEWALL '00**, Defensive Coordinator **SCOTT YODER '01**, linebackers coach **AARON BACKHAUS '00**, receivers coach **JIM RYAN** (St. John Fisher '00), quarterbacks coach **JON DRACH** (Western Michigan '04), running backs coach **JOHN MANLEY** (Brockport '72), and defensive line coach **TERRY MUFFLEY** (East Stroudsburg '74).

2008 CAPTAINS—Hobart seniors **RICH DOYLE**, **MATT DULIBA**, and **JEFF SANDERS** were voted by their peers to serve as team captains this season.

SCOUTING THE DUTCHMEN—Union brings a 1-3 overall record and an 0-2 Liberty League mark into today's game. The Dutchmen offense is averaging 142.5 yards rushing and 194.8 yards passing, while producing 19.8 points per game. The defensive is allowing 155.5 yards on the ground, 160.2 yards through the air, and 23.2 points. Sophomore running back Chris Coney leads the Liberty League and ranks 21st in the nation in rushing (125 yds/g, 6 TDs). First-year quarterback Andrew Connolly (79-36-3) directs the passing attack, throwing for 511 yards and two touchdowns. Senior tight end Josh McKelligan (17 rec, 199 yds) and junior wideout Jared Gourrier (15, 197, 2 TDs) are his top target. On the defensive side of the ball, three Dutchmen have recorded at least 30 tackles this season. Senior safety Kevin Rautenstrauch leads the way with 42, followed by junior linebacker John Peters (35) and senior linebacker Joe Catalano (32).

ON THE AIR—Every Hobart football game will be carried live by WEOS-FM (89.7/90.3 in Geneva, 88.1 in Ithaca). Veteran play-by-play man Ted Baker will describe all of the action.

GAME 1 • Hobart 28, Dickinson 21 Sept. 13, 2008

GENEVA—Hobart won its season opener 28-21 over visiting Dickinson. The Statesmen led 14-0 at halftime, but had to rally from a 21-14 deficit with two scores in the final four minutes for the victory. Hobart was outgained 405-331 offensively, but got the big plays when it needed it most.

The first half belonged to the Statesmen, who marched 65 yards on 12 plays for a touchdown on their first possession. RB **ANTHONY HOBAICA** capped the drive with a 3-yard scoring plunge.

FS **LANCE BOYINGTON** spoiled the Red Devils' best scoring chance of the first half, intercepting Ian Mitchell's pass into the end zone early in the second quarter.

Hobart doubled its lead with its final drive of the first half, moving 53 yards in 10 plays. QB **RICH DOYLE** hit WR **TYLER VINCENT** for 19 yards and the touchdown.

Mitchell was intercepted a second time to end the first half, as **CB DRAKE WOODARD** corralled the 36-yard heave as time expired. Hobart led 14-0 at the break.

The Red Devils broke through late in the third quarter on a 1-yard run by Greg Lord. The drive covered 62 yards in 12 plays. Early in the fourth quarter, Lord tied the game on a 2-yard run, capping an 11-play 62 yard drive.

Dickinson's defense forced Hobart to go three and out and used its next possession to take the lead. Mitchell hit WR Pat O'Connor on a short route. O'Connor used good blocking to go 20 yards to the end zone and a 21-14 lead.

The deficit jolted the Statesmen out of their second half slumber. Doyle found TE **MATT DULIBA** open up the middle for 31 yards and WR **ZACH SCHULZ** made a diving catch at the one for 38 more. Doyle finished the drive with a 1-yard keeper.

The Hobart defense also came to life, forcing the Red Devils to go three and out. The punt traveled just 12 yards to the Dickinson 47.

Six plays later, Doyle hit Schulz on a curl route for 16 yards and a touchdown. K **CONOR CALLAHAN** capped a perfect debut with his fourth successful PAT to give the Statesmen a 28-21 lead with 54 seconds left in regulation.

Mitchell moved the Red Devils down to the Hobart 25 with 9.4 seconds remaining. LB **JEFF SANDERS** broke up Dickinson's first shot at the tying score, leaving less than six seconds remaining. Boyington was the hero on second down, knocking what could have been a tying score out of the hands of O'Connor as time expired.

LB **JUSTIN HAGER** led the Hobart defense with a game-high 11 tackles, while DT **RYAN ARUCK** and Sanders each recorded 10 stops.

GAME 2 • Hobart 21, Carnegie Mellon 16 Sept. 20, 2008

PITTSBURGH—LB **JUSTIN HAGER** broke the game record for tackles, leading the Statesmen to a 21-16 victory at Carnegie Mellon. He posted 21 stops, two more than the previous mark.

LB **JEFF SANDERS** finished with 20 tackles, while DT **RYAN ARUCK** contributed 11 stops. CB **DRAKE WOODARD** logged two interceptions.

The Statesmen scored late in the first quarter when TE **MATT DULIBA** caught a 6-yard pass from QB **RICH DOYLE** with 3:42 remaining, completing a four-play, 57-yard drive that was set up by Woodard's first INT.

The pick was the start of either a superb defensive first half or a sloppy offensive first half, depending on one's perspective. CMU and Hobart combined to throw five first half interceptions, three by Doyle (27-14-3, 219 yds, 3 TDs) and two by Tartan Phil Pantalone (14-8-2, 102, 1).

CMU managed to break out of the funk just before halftime, engineering a 14-play, 89-yard drive that ended on a 20-yard pass from Pantalone to Ryan Phillips, 45 seconds before the intermission. The teams went into the locker room tied 7-all.

After both teams punted away their first two possessions of the second half, Hobart put up the only points of the third quarter. Doyle again found Duliba, this time from 5-yards out, to put the Statesmen in front 14-7 with 28 ticks left.

The Tartans responded with a game-tying drive, capped by a 2-yard dive by fullback Anthony Ruzga early in the fourth quarter.

On the next two drives, the teams traded punts, but Hobart won the field position battle. After three plays that netted just 1 yard to the CMU 11, Carnegie Mellon launched a 38-yard punt that **LANCE BOYINGTON** fielded at the CMU 49. Boyington's 15-yard return gave the Statesmen first and 10 from the 34. Doyle connected with WR **ZACH SCHULZ** on first down for all 34 yards and a 21-14 lead.

The Tartans responded by moving from their own 36 to the Hobart 5 in 12 plays with just over a minute remaining. Facing fourth down and two Pantalone's pass was broken up by Woodard.

Four plays later, Hobart took an intentional safety with 3 seconds to go rather than risk a blocked punt, accounting for the final points of the day.

RB **ANTHONY HOBAICA** rushed for a game-high 111 yards on 18 carries, marking the first time a Statesman has gained 100 yards on the ground since Nov. 11, 2006.

GENEVA—Hobart won its Liberty League opener 27-14 over Susquehanna. The Statesmen scored the first 20 points of the game.

Hobart gained 370 yards of offense, including a season-high 221 on the ground. RB **ANTHONY HOBAICA** led the way with 80 yards rushing and a touchdown as well as 24 yards receiving and another TD, while RB **ANDREW MARLIER** rushed for a team-high 97 yards and a touchdown.

Hager recovered for the Statesmen. Two plays later, Hobaica sprung free on Hobart's longest scoring play of the season, sprinting 35 yards to the end zone.

On the ensuing possession, Susquehanna QB Rich Palazzi was sacked by Hager, jarring the ball lose for DE **TONY GUIDETTI** to recover at the Crusaders' 35. Three plays later, Marlier punched it in from 3 yards out. The extra point was wide left leaving the Statesmen a 13-0 lead.

Hobart made it 20-0 late in the second half, using a 33-yard scramble by QB **RICH DOYLE** and a 31-yard completion from Doyle to Hobaica to cover the 64 yards to the end zone.

Susquehanna got on the board midway through the third quarter. Paveletz carried six times for 42 yards, including the final 7, on the 10-play, 83-yard drive.

The Statesmen answered midway through the fourth quarter when Doyle hit WR **GARTH MURATORI** for 10 yards and a TD, capping an 11-play, 49-yard march that ran 5:35 off the clock.

QB Derek Pope engineered the final scoring drive of the day. He completed 7-of-9 passes for 60 yards, the last 8 on SE J.J. Moran's scoring catch with 1:38 left. The Crusaders attempted an on-side kick, but the ball sailed out of bounds untouched and Hobart ran out the clock.

CANTON—The Statesmen leaned on their defense in a 16-10 victory over St. Lawrence. LB **JUSTIN HAGER** led Hobart to its 17th consecutive win over the Saints with a game-high 13 tackles.

The Statesmen struggled to move the football in the first quarter, punting on their first three possessions, but the Saints struggled just as much.

CB **CHRIS SZYMANSKI** stopped SLU's first drive with an interception at the Hobart 20. After the Saints punted on their second possession, CB **DRAKE WOODARD** stopped St. Lawrence's third drive with an interception at the Hobart 27.

SLU opened the scoring early in the second quarter when QB J.P. Kearney capped an 11-play, 63-yard drive with a 1-yard keeper. The extra point gave the Saints a 7-0 lead. The Statesmen answered with their first scoring drive. From 28 yards out, K **CONOR CALLAHAN** booted his first career field goal to make it 7-3.

St. Lawrence was on its way to marching back down the field for another score when DE **TONY GUIDETTI** sacked Kearney for a 14-yard loss on third and 7 from the Hobart 25, pushing the Saints out of field goal range.

The Hobart offense solved its first half struggles with its first drive of the second half. Hobart moved 66 yards in just four plays, capped by an 11-yard scoring run by RB **ANTHONY HOBAICA**, to take a 9-7 lead. The extra point was no good. On the Saints' final drive, they gained another first down, but on third and 11 from their own 45 LB **RYAN ROBINSON** streaked into the backfield to drop Kearney for a sack and a 12 yard loss and St. Lawrence was force to punt again. Hobart gained two first downs and ran the final 2:57 off the clock.
