Lone Star Showdown

GEORGETOWN I3, Hobart 5

March 11

SAN ANTONIO—For the first time in 32 years, two Division I lacrosse programs squared off in Texas. The fifth-ranked Georgetown Hoyas lived up to their billing, topping the Statesmen 13-5 at the Texas Military Institute's Howell Field.

Hobart opened the scoring at the 10:28 mark of the first quarter, but the Hoyas responded with the next six tallies, including two each from senior Jordan Vettoretti and junior Mike Boynton.

Junior midfielder **BRIAN JOY** broke the run with 32 seconds remaining in the half with a man-up goal, but the Hoyas answered just four seconds later on a goal by senior Mike Hammer to head into halftime with a 7-2 lead.

The teams traded goals in the third quarter, and the Hoyas scored four straight to start

the fourth, putting the game out of reach. Vettoretti and Hammer led Georgetown with five points each. Senior attackman JOHN BOGOSIAN became just the fourth Statesman to play four seasons of

Division I lacrosse and score 100 career points. Bogosian led Hobart with a pair of goals, while sophomore NATE HILL added a goal and an assist.

For Hobart, senior **MIKE BORSZ** made 14 saves in 51 minutes, while sophomore **DAN VALENTE** turned away one down the stretch. Georgetown's Rich D'Andrea made 11 stops to earn the win.

Hobart 16, LAFAYETTE 7

March 15

EASTON, Pa.—The Hobart lacrosse team turned in a near-perfect first half and rolled past host Lafayette 16-7 in a Patriot League matchup at Rappolt Field. First-year **MIKE CONKLIN** led all scorers with four goals and an assist.

The Statesmen's defense, led by senior goalie **MIKE BORSZ**, negated the Leopards' attack. Borsz played the opening 30 minutes, posting nine saves, including at least three from point-blank-range, without allowing a goal.

Meanwhile, Hobart's offense posted four scores in the opening 15 minutes, including a pair of goals by senior JOHN BOGOSIAN. The Statesmen began to fire on all cylinders in the second stanza. Bogosian kick-started a seven-goal quarter for Hobart with his third of the game and team-leading 12th of the season. Senior KRIS SHORE, junior GEOFF ZBIKOWSKI, senior TIM BOOTH, and junior MARK

WILLIAMSON followed with single tallies to balloon the Statesmen's lead to 9-0 with 3:26 remaining in the First half.

Conklin scored twice—just 11 seconds apart—in the final two minutes to send Hobart into halftime with an 11-0 lead.


Lafayette finally broke through the Statesmen defense in the second half. In fact, the Leopards scored six of the first seven goals of the second half to creep to within six, 12-6, with 9:47 remaining in the game. Pat Lennon led the Leopards in scoring with four goals.

The Statesmen dashed any hopes of a comeback with four of the final five goals, including a nifty move on a shorthanded goal by sophomore **NATE HILL**.

Hobart completely dominated the contest, outshooting Lafayette 49-37, and boasting a 35-28 advantage on ground balls. The Statesmen were perfect on clears, converting all 23 of their attempts while limiting the Leopards to 20-of-30.

Booth and sophomore **BLAKE REARDON** controlled the faceoffs. Booth won 9-of-14 restarts, while Reardon was 7-of-11. Both players picked up a game-high five ground balls.

In goal, **DAN VALENTE** finished with 10 saves in the second half for the Statesmen, while Kevin DeVito and Koch combined for 14 saves for Lafayette.

HOBART 9, Lehigh 4

March 22

GENEVA—The Hobart defense continued its strong showing over Patriot League opponents, limiting visiting Lehigh to just three even-strength goals, as the Statesmen topped the Mountain Hawks 9-4 on McCooey Field in front of 1,153 fans. Senior goalie **MIKE BORSZ** went the distance and earned the win with 11 saves.

"Our defense did an outstanding job against a solid offensive team," Head Coach MATT KERWICK '90 said. "I feel we played very well offensively at times, we just didn't finish all of our opportunities."

Hobart's defense limited Lehigh's top two scorers—senior Tony Lowe and sophomore Andrew Lucas entered the game averaging a combined four goals per game—to one goal apiece. The Mountain Hawks also struggled to solve Hobart's man-down defense, taking advantage of just 1-of-9 extra-man opportunities.

While the Statesmen may not have produced as many goals as Kerwick would have liked, it wasn't because of a lack of opportunities. Senior midfielder **TIM BOOTH** dominated the faceoff X, winning 11-of-15 restarts and collecting a game-high 11 ground balls.

The Statesmen offense got off to a fast start. First-year midfielder **PATRICK MEADE** rifled home a shot at the 11:24 mark. Senior **JOHN BOGOSIAN** made it a two-goal game less than two minutes later, and Meade added his second tally just 10 seconds before the end of the opening frame.

In the second quarter, Lucas got Lehigh on the board just 18 seconds into the stanza. The goal halted Borsz's shutout streak against Patriot League opponents, dating back to the 2002 Holy Cross game, at 102 minutes, 29 seconds.

Bogosian responded with a man-up goal, assisted by sophomore midfielder **NATE HILL.** Lowe scored 33 seconds later, but senior midfielder **SEAN KENT** answered with his second goal of the season to send Hobart into the break with a 5-2 lead. The third quarter saw Bogosian sandwich a pair of goals around a Lehigh tally to give the Statesmen a 7-3 lead with 15 minutes remaining.

The Mountain Hawks continued to hang around, closing to within three, 7-4, at the 13:05 mark of the fourth on a man-up goal by junior midfielder Kurt Gerry. Senior long-stick midfielder **BRYAN BOME** iced the game with his first collegiate goal at 7:08, and Hill added the final goal of the afternoon 15 seconds before the final horn.

Sophomore goalie Tom Ellis made 16 saves for Lehigh.

Syracuse 15, HOBART 12

March 25

GENEVA—The unranked Hobart lacrosse team gave fifth-ranked Syracuse a scare in front of a raucous crowd at McCooey Field, but the Orangemen scored four of the game's last five goals to post a 15-12 victory and avoid back-to-back losses for the first time since 1995. Hobart senior attackman **JOHN BOGOSIAN** (5-1) and Syracuse senior attackman Liam Banks (2-4) shared top scoring honors with six points apiece.

The Statesmen got off to a strong start, controlling the tempo of play in the first quarter and outshooting the Orange 10-3. Bogosian scored the opening frame's lone goal to give Hobart a lead it wouldn't relinquish until early in the third quarter.

In the second quarter, Bogosian and first-year attackman **MIKE CONKLIN** logged goals less than 30 seconds apart to give the Statesmen a 3-0 lead at the 12:37 mark. Syracuse broke into the scoring column 36 seconds later when junior attackman Michael Powell scored a man-up goal.

Less than a minute later, Bogosian restored the three-goal lead and 22 seconds after that, sophomore midfielder **NATE HILL** scored a man-up goal to give Hobart a four-goal lead, the largest lead of the game for either team. Junior midfielder Steve Vallone scored at the 10:01 mark to pull SU to within two, concluding a six-goal flurry in a span of just 3:03. Hobart senior midfielder **SEAN KENT** put the Statesmen back in front by four, but senior attackman Liam Banks scored twice in the final 5:24 of the half to head into the break with Hobart leading 6-4.

Vallone scored the first two goals of the second half to forge the first of six ties. The teams traded goals to make it a 7-7 game, then Vallone scored his 13th of the season to give the Orangemen their first lead of the game. The Upstate New York rivals traded goals until the final minute of the third quarter when Conklin and sophomore midfielder **CHRIS SCANLON** connected on back-to-back goals to give Hobart a 10-9 lead—its final advantage of the game—heading into the final frame.

Syracuse scored twice to open the fourth to take an 11-10 lead, but Bogosian forged the final tie with 11:02 remaining. The Orangemen responded with the next three goals, to take a 14-11 lead. Bogosian gave the Statesmen fans hope with 4:24 left, netting his team-leading 21st goal and trimming Hobart's deficit to two, but Vallone scored his 14th goal of the season at the 3:07 mark to close out the scoring.

In goal, sophomore Jay Pfeifer recorded 10 saves and the win, while senior **MIKE BORSZ** made nine stops for the Statesmen.

LEWISBURG, Pa.—Bucknell scored with 71 seconds remaining to steal a crucial Patriot League showdown with the Statesmen, 8-7. The loss dropped Hobart to 4-3 overall, 3-1 in the league, while Bucknell improved to 5-2, 2-0.

The Statesmen opened the fourth quarter at rainy Christy Mathewson Memorial Stadium with a 6-5 advantage. The Bison erased that lead with a pair of scores five minutes apart to take a 7-6 lead with just over three minutes remaining.

Hobart caught a break with 1:58 showing on the game clock when the Bison were whistled for a push that gave the Statesmen a 30-second man-advantage. Hobart only needed eight. Senior midfielder TIM BOOTH, who fired shots at eye level or above all afternoon, rifled a bounce shot between the legs of senior goalie Justin Sussman to tie the game.

Bucknell won the ensuing faceoff and ripped a shot on senior MIKE BORSZ. The Camillus, N.Y., native was up to the task, deflecting the would-be game-winner, unfortunately the Bison retained possession, setting up the go-ahead score.

Booth won the ensuing faceoff, allowing first-year attackman MIKE CONKLIN, who had a goal and an assist in the contest, to fire a shot with 63 seconds remaining, but Sussman watched it into his crosse, and Bucknell ran out the clock.

Both Borsz and Sussman were exceptional in the cage. Borsz allowed just five even-strength goals all afternoon, while logging 14 saves. Sussman made 16 stops.

A nail-biter from the start, neither team led by more than a single goal. Junior attackman MARK WILLIAMSON, who led all scorers with three tallies, opened the scoring just over four minutes into the game. Following a Bucknell goal, senior midfielder KRIS SHORE put home his fifth goal of the season, but the Bison responded with the next two goals to take a 3-2 lead into the second quarter. Shore finished with a goal and two assists.

The teams traded goals in the second frame to send Bucknell into the locker room with a 4-3 lead.

To start the third, Booth and Williamson scored for the visitors, and the Bison answered with their third man-up goal of the game to knot the contest at five-all. Williamson scored again to close the third, setting the stage for the dramatic final 15.

HAMILTON, N.Y.—Senior goalie MIKE BORSZ was outstanding in the net, making 17 stops to help the Statesmen hold off Colgate 10-8 in an important Patriot League matchup. Senior TIM BOOTH led all scorers with three goals and an assist.

Hobart jumped out to a 5-1 lead in the first quarter, getting goals from five different players. Senior KRIS SHORE made it 6-1 just 57 seconds into the second stanza with his second goal of the game and seventh of the season. It was all Raiders after that as Colgate rattled off a 5-1 run to pull to within one goal, setting up an exciting final frame.

First-year attackman MIKE CONKLIN gave the Statesmen a two-goal cushion with a man-up score

26 seconds into the fourth quarter, but Colgate's Jeff Vander Meulen made it a onegoal game just over a minute later. The Raiders knotted the match for the first time all evening with 4:17 left on an unassisted goal by Nick Gerken. Booth won the ensuing faceoff and took it straight to the goal to put the Statesmen ahead for good at 9-8. Sophomore CHRIS SCANLON added an insurance score with 3:39 left to make it a 10-8 game.

The Radiers outshot Hobart 43-30, but the Statesmen won 14 of 22 faceoffs and edged Colgate 34-33 on ground balls. Hobart was 1-for-4 on the extra man, while the Raiders went 2-for-6.

STATE COLLEGE, Pa.—The Statesmen scored first, but were unable to keep Penn State's offense under wraps, falling to the Nittany Lions 14-10 in a non-conference contest. Senior JOHN BOGOSIAN paced the Hobart offense with three goals and an assist.

Senior TIM BOOTH and sophomore CHRIS SCANLON scored in the opening five minutes to take a 2-1 lead over Penn State. The Lions answered with eight unanswered goals before Booth and sophomore NATE HILL scored back-to-back goals to make it a 9-4 game midway through the second quarter. Penn State scored twice more to head into halftime with an 11-5 lead.

Bogosian and junior MARK WILLIAMSON tallied a pair of goals in the third period to make it 12-7, but goals from Rob Booth and Will Cutler early in the fourth quarter put the game out of reach at 14-7. Bogosian started a Statesmen run at the 10:29 mark of the final frame as Hobart tallied the final three goals of the contest.

Senior MIKE BORSZ and sophomore DAN VALENTE combined for 12 saves in the game, while Penn State goalie Chris Garrity made 11 stops.

The Lions held a 39-34 advantage on shots, but the Statesmen got the better of the faceoffs (17-of-28) and scored on 2-of-3 man-up opportunities.



John Bogosian '03 notched a hat trick plus an assist in Happy Valley, but it wasn't enough to lift the Statesmen over Penn State. A three-time All-Patriot League selection, Bogosian led Hobart in scoring for three straight seasons.

DENVER 15, Hobart 8

April 12

DENVER—For the first time during the 2003 campaign, Hobart's opponent scored the first goal of the game. It was not a good sign.

The University of Denver lacrosse team scored eight of the game's first nine goals en route to a 15-8 victory over the visiting Statesmen at Pioneer Field in front of 540 sun-drenched fans.

The Pioneers charged out to a 3-0 lead before sophomore **NATE HILL** set up first-year **MIKE CONKLIN's** 12th goal of the season. At least one of the two had a hand in seven of Hobart's eight goals on the day.

As the second quarter began, Hobart trailed 3-1, but Denver netted five unanswered goals in the first six minutes of the frame to build an 8-1 advantage. The Statesmen halted the run at the 6:18 mark when Conklin returned the favor, setting up Hill's eighth goal of the year. Hobart trailed 8-2 heading into halftime.

The Pioneers struck first in the second half, but the Statesmen responded just 10 seconds later. Following Denver's ninth score, senior **TIM BOOTH** won the ensuing faceoff and raced into the restraining area, feeding sophomore **SEAN REED**, who fired home Hobart's third tally.

The quick strike sparked a 3-0 Hobart run, with Conklin and senior **JOHN BOGOSIAN** accounting for the other two goals, to pull the Statesmen to within four, 9-5. Hobart was still within striking distance with 8:33 remaining, 10-6, but the Pioneers scored five of the next six goals to put the game out of reach.

Conklin finished with a career-high-matching four goals and an assist, while Hill contributed a goal and four assists. Bogosian chipped in a pair of scores. Booth enjoyed another strong outing at the faceoff X, winning 14-of-22 and collecting a game-high eight ground balls, in addition to two assists.

Hobart outshot Denver 44-36, but the hot goaltending of Jeff Nuziato (19 saves) kept the Statesmen attack at bay. Senior **MIKE BORSZ** and sophomore **DAN VALENTE** combined for seven saves.
