STATESMEN END 12-YEAR DROUGHT— Swift's late tallies lead Hobart to 5-4 upset of RIT

GENEVA, N.Y.—Hobart first-year JONATHAN SWIFT scored two goals in the final five minutes to lead the Statesmen hockey team to a 5-4 upset victory over 10th-ranked RIT in front of an electric crowd at the Geneva Recreation Complex on Feb. 25. Playing in their final regular season

home game, seniors TREVOR **GOWAN, CARL MICHAELSON,** and R.C. SCHMIDT earned their first career victory over the Tigers and Hobart's first since 1992.

"It's unbelievable." Michaelson said. "From where we started four years ago, when Coach [Mark] Taylor came in, he turned it all around. Year after year we've been building up to this. It's a great feeling."

RIT (12-6-5, 6-2-2 ECAC West) wasted little time getting on the board as sophomore Darren

After weathering some heavy pressure from the **EDWARD POIRIER** gave Hobart (13-7-5, 7-2-1 ECAC West) a 2-1 advantage with a perfect shot over the shoulder of RIT goaltender George Eliopoulos.

After a scoreless second period, sophomore **LEE CARRIER** made it a two-goal game with a short-handed goal just two minutes into the final period.

the game with a pair of goals by Harris and senior Matt Moore within 22 seconds of each other. Seven minutes later, junior forward Brian Payant put the Tigers ahead again with a shot over the shoulder of junior goaltender ADAM LAVELLE.

Needing the win to stay in the hunt for the regular season crown and top seed in the ECAC West tourney, Hobart continued to pressure the RIT defense. Swift tied the game at four with five minutes left to play, putting back a rebound. Two minutes later, the rookie winger gave the Statesmen the victory with a power-play score on a pass from Poirier.

"I was following up the play and I think the two defensemen kind of forgot about me," Swift said. "Eddie made a nice pass to me and I was able to lift it into the upper left corner."

The Statesmen penalty kill was spectacular, holding RIT scoreless on five power-play chances. The Tigers held a 40-32 advantage on shots for the game.

Lavelle was outstanding in goal for Hobart. making 36 saves, including 14 in the first period, while Eliopoulos had 27 stops.

Later that evening, the Statesmen learned unranked Elmira had stunned Manhattanville 7-2 to give Hobart its first ECAC West regular season championship (see standings below).

The victory vaulted the Statesmen into the national rankings for the first time in the program's history. Hobart debuted at No. 14 in the US College Hockey Online (www.uscho.com) poll.

No. 2 RIT will face off against third-seeded Manhattanville in the first semifinal at 3 p.m., on March 5. Squash earns top-10 billing with strong showing in CSA Team Championships

GENEVA, N.Y.—The Hobart squash team capped a record-setting season with a top-10 ranking and two more UCAA weekly awards heading into the CSA Individual Championships March 5-7, at St. Lawrence. The Statesmen cracked the top-10 for the first time, crashing the elite party usually reserved for Ivies and six-time defending national champion Trinity.

Junior **HENRY CLUTSAM** and first-year **TUCKER CROCKETT** were named the UCAA Co-Performer and Co-Rookie of the Week, respectively. This is Crockett's fourth Rookie of the Week award from the UCAA, while Clutsam is receiving his first Performer of the Week honor.

Statesmen break win record, Upset Brown 5-4

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (Feb. 27)—The Hobart squash team pulled off an upset in the first round of the Hoehn Trophy. The 15th-ranked Statesmen knocked off No. 10 Brown, 5-4.

The win raises Hobart's record to 14-8 overall, the highest win total in the program's 38 varsity seasons. It also marks the first time this season that the Statesmen have triumphed over a higher ranked team. Hobart was 0-8 this year against higher ranked teams.

Hobart won just two of the top five matches—sophomore **GAVIN JOHNSTONE-BUTCHER** prevailed at No. 3 and Clutsam won at No. 4—but the bottom of the lineup came through with three 3-1 victories to propel the Statesmen into the semifinals.

Junior FREDDY COOK, first-year ANDY CONRAD, and senior RICHARD REUTTER

produced the crucial victories at Nos. 7-9. Both Cook and Reutter dropped their first set before rallying to take the next three.

The Hoehn Trophy is the second division, teams nine through 16, of the College Squash Association National Championships. Thirty-eight collegiate squash teams competed in five divisions.

No. II Amherst falls to Hobart 5-4

WALLINGFORD, Conn. (Feb. 28)—Hobart assured the program's highest finish in the CSA Championships with a 5-4 victory over No. 11 Amherst in the semifinals. The Statesmen advanced to tangle with ninth-

ranked Williams for the Hoehn Trophy.

Hobart could finish no worse than 10th in the final CSA standings, besting the program's previous high-water mark by one spot. The victory improved Hobart's record to 15-8, and marked the second time in as many matches the Statesmen had bumped off a higher seed.

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (Feb. 29)—Ninth-ranked Williams lived up to its ranking defeating Hobart 7-2. **TEJVIR RATHORE** and Crockett posted the wins for Hobart.

Cagers end season at 9-16, 4-10 in UCAA

BASKETBALL—It was a tough run through the UCAA for the Statesmen this season. Hobart managed just four wins in league play, and only seven victories total after the New Year's holiday.

The team's roster featured just a single senior, **BRAD STRAIT** (12.0 ppg, 44 3FGM), so the positives the Statesmen saw down the stretch are reason to look forward to next season.

Hobart defeated UCAA Tournament team St. Lawrence in Bristol Gym 88-80 in a fantastic offensive display that saw the Statesmen shoot 71 percent from the floor in the second half.

Hobart also put on a clinic in its final appearance in Bristol Gym. The Statesmen dismantled Hartwick, 96-45. Five players reached double digits in scoring, led by first-year guard **MIKE MANNING's** 21-point effort. A native of Mastic, N.Y., Manning averaged 9.6 ppg and recorded a team-high 30 steals this season.

Unlike last season, when Hobart graduated more than half its starting lineup, as well as more than half of its scoring and rebounding, the Statesmen will welcome back eight players with experience in the starting lineup, including their leading scorer, junior forward **JOE FLACKE** (12.2 ppg, 7.0 rpg).

Butler holds off Hobart charge, 7-6

BROOKLANDVILLE, Md.—The Hobart lacrosse team took a 3-1 lead early in its season opener with Butler on Feb. 28, but the Bulldogs made the Statesmen wait more than 38 minutes for their next goal in a 7-6 Butler win at St. Paul's School. Attackman MARK

WILLIAMSON led all scorers with three goals.

The Bulldogs opened the scoring midway through the first quarter, but Hobart responded less than a minute later when midfielder CHRIS SCANLON fired home an unassisted score. Midfielder JOHN SODEN won the ensuing faceoff and, 22 seconds later, attackman NATE HILL set up Williamson's first score.

Soden was outstanding in his Hobart debut, winning 12-of-16 faceoffs and collecting five ground balls.

The Statesmen got off to a fast start in the second quarter, waiting just 44 seconds for Williamson's second score, but then Hobart's scoring dried up, although not for a lack of opportunities. The Statesmen outshot Butler 22-9 in the first half, but the Bulldogs keeper was up to the task, posting seven first half stops.

Butler scored just 11 seconds before the half to trim Hobart's lead to just a single goal, 3-2. The Bulldog offense came to life in the third quarter, outshooting the Statesmen 12-10 while netting four unanswered goals to take a 6-3 lead into the final frame.

Butler completed a 6-0 run midway through the fourth quarter, but the 7-3 deficit awoke the sleeping Hobart attack.

Hill kick-started the ill-fated comeback with his first goal of the campaign at the 5:53 mark. Two minutes later, midfielder **NATE** MOLINARI fed Williamson, who completed his hat trick and pulled Hobart within two, 7-5.

Near the three-minute mark, Williamson put another in the Butler net and appeared to get Hobart into a one-goal game, but the score was waved off for a crease violation.

At the 2:02 mark, Hobart did make it a one-goal game, this time on attackman MIKE CONKLIN's goal. Looking to force overtime, the Statesmen took three shots down the stretch: the first sailed wide, the second was stopped by a spectacular diving save and the third hit the post.

DAN VALENTE made 10 saves in his first collegiate start. Hill and defenseman GREG McCARTHY collected a game-high six ground balls apiece, helping Hobart to a 48-30 advantage.

Hobart opens its final Patriot League loop when it returns to action at 1 p.m., on March 6, at Holy Cross.
