Hobart wins West, makes Ist NCAA Tournament appearance

Lavelle named All-America

ICE HOCKEY—Hobart junior goaltender **ADAM LAVELLE** was named to the JOFA/ACHA College Division All-American second-team, capping off a record-breaking season for both him and the Statesmen. Lavelle is Hobart's first hockey All-American in the program's 26-year history.

Lavelle had another outstanding season, leading the Statesmen to their first ECAC West title and first appearance in the NCAA Tournament. In just three seasons between

Hill sets up lacrosse win over Bucknell, 13-9

GENEVA (April 3)—The Hobart lacrosse team scored an important Patriot League victory on soggy McCooey Field with a 13-9 decision over visiting Bucknell University. Junior attackman **NATE HILL** led the charge with two goals and five assists, matching his careerhighs in both assists and points.

A nail-biter in the first half, Hobart (4-4, 4-1 PL) scored the game's opening goal when sophomore attackman **MIKE CONKLIN** fired home a feed from Hill. It was the first of three Hill-to-Conklin tallies on the night.

From the opening score until the horn signaled the end of the first half, the teams traded goals, heading into the break tied 4-4.

The Bison (4-5, 2-2) took their first lead of the contest 49 seconds into the third frame on junior attackman Chris Cara's goal. Statesmen first-year midfielder **CHRIS DAVID** tied the game at 5-all with the first of his three goals on the night, all in the third quarter.

Bucknell grabbed its final lead of the game with 7:16 remaining in the third on a man-up goal by first-year midfielder Kirk Klett. Just over a minute later, David forged the sixth and final tie.

Shortly thereafter, things began to slip away from the Bison. Bucknell was nearly perfect in the opening 30 minutes (12-13 clears, 7-10 faceoffs, 1 penalty for 30 seconds), but Hobart rode the Bison on 7-of-15 clear attempts in the second half, won 9-of-15 faceoffs, and converted all of its three man-up opportunities.

The first extra-man score, by Conklin, gave the Statesmen an 8-6 lead. It was the first time either team had led by more than a single goal in the team's annual meeting since the fourth quarter of the 2002 showdown, a game Hobart won 12-11 on McCooey Field.

Back-to-back even strength goals, followed by consecutive extra-man goals, ballooned the Statesmen's lead to 11-6 with 10:03 remaining.

The Bison managed back-to-back goals of their own near the eight-minute mark, but Hill fed Conklin on two straight tallies 46 seconds apart to seal the victory.

Junior attackman Patrick Christensen led Bucknell with five goals and an assist.

Hobart junior defenseman **GREG McCARTHY** did an excellent job of limiting Cara's effectiveness. The Bison player entered the game averaging a Division I-high 5.5 points per game, but was held to a goal and three assists, with only two of those points coming at even strength.

In goal, Hobart junior **DAN VALENTE** made 15 saves for the win while gathering a game-high nine ground balls, including several interceptions that prevented inclose scoring chances. Sophomore Matt Baran turned away 16 shots for the Bison.

The win over Bucknell means Hobart can clinch a spot in the Patriot League Tournament with a win over Colgate, when the Raiders visit McCooey Field on April 7.

the pipes, he has taken over the records book, owning the career records for saves (2,011), wins (35), and goals against average (3.65), as well as the single-season marks for saves (795) and wins (14).

An All-ECAC West first-team honoree, Lavelle led the Statesmen on a record seven-game win streak, including a pair of victories over conference rival RIT, to secure the ECAC West regular season and tournament titles. During that stretch, he averaged 29 saves per game and posted a 2.14 goals against average and a .930 save percentage.

In the conference championship game, Lavelle turned away nearly ever RIT shot, making 35 stops, including 19 in the second period, to earn the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award. He finished the season with 619 saves (25.8/g), a 3.64 goals against average and an .884 save percentage.

Hobart closed out the year with a 9-5 loss to defending national champion Norwich University in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Finishing the season with a 15-8-5 overall record, the Statesmen matched the 1978-79 team's mark for wins in a season and broke the record for winning percentage.

Lavelle was in good company in the postseason awards department. Head Coach MARK TAYLOR was named ECAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season, while junior forward CRAIG LEVEY and first-year forward JONATHAN SWIFT were named ECAC West Co-Player of the Year and Co-Rookie of the Year, respectively.

In just his fourth season at the helm, Taylor has led the Statesmen (15-8-5, 7-2-1 ECAC West) to new heights, posting consecutive winning seasons for the first time in the program's history as well as winning its first-regular season and postseason championships.

A 2003 ECAC West first-team selection, Levey sparked the Hobart offense all season. Leading the team with 17 goals and 17 assists for 34 points, he tallied a season-high four points on a hat trick and an assist in Hobart's win at Elmira.

A power winger for the Statesmen, Swift caught fire at the end of the regular season, scoring four goals, including two gamewinners, and notching two assists in the final three contests. He tallied the game-tying and game-winning goals in Hobart's 5-4 regular season victory over RIT.

Sophomore forward **WILL BRAME** and junior defenseman **GREG GALLAGHER** captured All-ECAC West second-team accolades, while Swift and first-year defenseman **MIKE POLSONETTI** were named to the All-Rookie Team.



Weymuller, Rathore headline All-UCAA team

GENEYA, N.Y.—Hobart Squash Head Coach **CAROL WEYMULLER** and junior **TEJYIR RATHORE** were named the 2004 Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year and Player

of the Year, respectively. The Statesmen dominated the awards, placing four players on the first-team, while five others received honorable mention accolades.

Joining Rathore on the first-team were junior **HENRY CLUTSAM**, sophomore **GAVIN JOHNSTONE-BUTCHER**, and first-year **PRATEEK PATNI**.

Senior RICHARD REUTTER, juniors FREDDY COOK and ANDREW SCOTT, and first-years ANDY CONRAD and TUCKER CROCKETT each earned honorable mention.

In her ninth season at the helm, Weymuller led the Hobart squash team to new heights during the 2003-04 season. She guided the Statesmen to the inaugural UCAA Championship and helped them to a 15-9 overall record, the highest wins total in the program's

history. Under her tutelage, Hobart finished second in the Hoehn Trophy and 10th overall at the team championships, the squad's best finish.

A three-time UCAA Performer of the Week, Rathore finished the season with an 18-9 record, including a perfect 6-0 against UCAA opponents. Playing all season at No. 1, he

received the third seed in the Malloy Cup of the College Squash Association Individual Championships and advanced to the semifinal round. He boasts a 48-26 career record.

Playing in the top half of the lineup all season, Clutsam racked up a team-high 19 wins, with an overall record of 19-9. He represented the Statesmen at the CSA Individual Championships, advancing to the semifinal round of the consolation draw before losing to sixth-seeded Ben Schippers of Bates.

Johnstone-Butcher filled the No. 2 and No. 3 slots throughout the season, compiling a 17-10 record. A two-sport athlete (crew), he has amassed a 28-16 record in two seasons on the squash court.

Playing in the second spot, Patni finished his rookie season with a 9-13 overall record and a 5-1 mark against conference foes. He was named UCAA Rookie of the Week after going 3-0 to help the Statesmen capture the first UCAA Championship.

Statesmen eights stun 13th-ranked Michigan

ITHACA, N.Y.—The Hobart crew produced a stunning upset of the University of Michigan on March 27. The Statesmen varsity eight defeated the Wolverines, who were ranked 13th in the country in the latest US Rowing Association poll, by 7.6 seconds and topped the host Ithaca Bombers by 11.2 seconds.

Hobart's freshmen eight also defeated Michigan's first freshmen eight by 7.9 seconds and Ithaca by 26.4 seconds.

"Our outstanding performance this early in the season is an important first step in attaining our goal of top finishes at this year's New York State and ECAC postseason championships," Head Coach MIKE GUERRIERI said.

Hobart's freshman four also was victorious by 14 seconds over Michigan's entry.

Hobart's varsity eight was led by senior stroke HAVILLAND CAMPBELL, junior MICHAEL HOEPP, first-years SEP LEVATICH and MICHAEL GRENIER, and sophomores DAN GILBERT, GARDNER LORING, JM CHADONIC, TIMOTHY FAXON, and GAVIN JOHNSTONE-BUTCHER.

One week later, Hobart's varsity eight and freshmen eight again defeated Ithaca's best offerings. The varsity eight finished nine seconds ahead of the Bombers, winning the Statesmen Duel Race Trophy.

HWS third at MAISA North Spring No. I

THROGS NECK, N.Y. (April 3-4)—A few days after moving up five spots to No. 3 in the national rankings, the Hobart and William Smith sailing team captured third place out of 18 teams with 35 points at the MAISA North Spring No. 1 Regatta at New York Maritime. Queen's grabbed top honors, while Columbia picked up the runner-up spot.

Racing in the A division for HWS were senior **MORA O'MALLEY** and first-year **LAUREN ANDERSON**. The duo finished among the top-10 boats in each of the four races, including a victory in the third and a runner-up finish in the opening race, compiling 19 points for third place.

In the B division, junior **EMILY BARKOW** and first-year **NATE OWEN** turned in three top-three performances, including a victory in the second race, finishing the weekend with 16 points for third place as well.
