

Hoyas 11, Statesmen 9

GENEVA, N.Y.—The 16th-ranked Statesmen put a scare into fifth-ranked Georgetown at McCooley Field, but the Hoyas overcame a five-goal first half deficit to post an 11-9 win. Georgetown outscored the Statesmen 6-1 in the pivotal third quarter, turning a four-goal halftime deficit into an 8-7 lead.

The Hoyas opened the scoring 1:27 into the contest on the first of Trevor Casey's two goals. Both offenses were quiet over the next 10 minutes.

JUSTIN PORTER, DARYL VELTMAN, and **SEAN REED** scored back-to-back-to-back goals in less than three minutes to give Hobart a 3-1 lead. **NATE HILL** scored twice to start the second quarter, beating his defender from behind the cage and depositing a low shot past goalie Rich D'Andrea on both efforts. **PATRICK MEADE** closed out Hobart's string of six unanswered goals with an unassisted marker at 3:04 of the second quarter.

Georgetown stopped the bleeding 93 second before halftime when Nick Miaritis netted the first of his two tallies on the day.

The Hoyas came out of the break a changed team. After Hobart posted a successful clear on each of its first eight attempts, Georgetown rode the Statesmen on six of their 10 attempts in the third frame. The extra offensive opportunities translated into six of the seven third quarter goals.

Miaritis made it a 6-3 game less than two minutes into the second half, and Brendan Cannon got the Hoyas within two at the 6:13 mark. At 3:48, Brodie Merrill converted a failed clear into his third goal of the season to trim Georgetown's deficit to just one, and seven seconds later, Sean Denihan knotted the contest at 7-all.

Hobart briefly reclaimed the lead on **CHRIS DAVID's** ninth goal of the year at the 2:45 mark, but the Hoyas scored the next three goals, spanning the third and fourth quarters to grab a 9-7 lead.

Consecutive scores just 28 seconds apart by **CHRIS SCANLON** and **MIKE CONKLIN** tied the game for the fourth and final time with 11:31 remaining. Casey scored the game-winner with just under six minutes to play and Denihan added an insurance goal three minutes later to ice the victory.

Hobart goalie **DAN VALENTE** made 17 saves, including eight in the third quarter.

Statesmen 16, Scarlet Knights 10

GENEVA, N.Y.—The 14th-ranked Statesmen rode **NATE MOLINARI's** career-high seven points to a 16-10 ECAC Lacrosse League victory over No. 16 Rutgers at McCooley Field. Molinari, who recorded two points in each of the first three quarters, finished the day with two goals, a game-high five assists, and a game-high six ground balls.

NATE HILL added six points (4-2) to the Hobart attack, while **CHRIS DAVID** added four goals. Nate Sanderson led Rutgers with four goals, while Leif Blomquist added four assists.

Rutgers seized its only lead of the contest at the 6:24 mark of the first quarter on a goal by Matt Gaines. The Statesmen responded with the last three goals of the opening frame. Hill sandwiched a pair of goals around a David score to give Hobart a 5-3 lead heading into the second quarter.

Sanderson scored two of the first three goals of the second quarter, both tallies pulled the Scarlet Knights—who lost four in a row, all to ranked foes—within one of the Statesmen, the last at 9:16.

The Statesmen started to pull away with four of the game's next five goals. Hill keyed the surge, scoring twice and setting up a third.

Rutgers scored the final goal of the first half to leave the Statesmen a 10-7 advantage.

After the break, Hobart, which was outscored 11-3 in the third quarter of its previous two games, played one of its strongest third frames of the season. The Statesmen logged the only two goals of the stanza, while limiting the Scarlet Knights to just four shots, only two of which were on frame. Goalie **DAN VALENTE** handled both offerings and finished the day with nine saves.

Hobart tacked on two more unanswered to start the fourth quarter for what proved to be an insurmountable 14-7 lead with 11:13 remaining.

The Statesmen controlled the flow of the play throughout the contest, clearing on 22-of-24 attempts, holding a 43-21 advantage on ground balls, and winning 16-of-27 faceoffs.

JOHN SODEN won 16 of the 25 restarts he took for Hobart.

In goal for Rutgers, Greg Havalchak made 11 stops.

Orange 13, Statesmen 12

GENEVA, N.Y.—Twelfth-ranked Hobart rallied from three goals down to tie No. 8 Syracuse at 12-12, only to have the Orange respond with a late goal to escape McCooley Field with a 13-12 victory. Greg Niewieroski scored what proved to be the game-winner with 4:13 remaining and goalie Jay Pfeifer made it stand up with two of his career-high 21 saves in the final minute.

Hobart's **CHRIS SCANLON** led all scorers with six points on four goals and two assists, while Steven Brooks paced Syracuse with three goals and two assists.

Neither team led by more than two goals until the Orange tallied the final two scores of the third quarter by Jarrett Park and Greg Rommel, and Brooks opened the fourth quarter scoring for a 12-9 lead with 8:45 remaining.

The Statesmen made a run of their own when **ALEX JESSUP** led a fast-break and found **MIKE CONKLIN**, who buried a shot on the crease for his second goal of the night at the 8:02 mark. **JOHN SODEN** won the ensuing faceoff and less than a minute later Scanlon fired home his final goal of the night.

Soden won the next faceoff as well to finish the night with a 14-12 record. With just 19 seconds run off the clock, Scanlon setup **NATE HILL's** third goal of the night.

A procedure call awarded Syracuse possession after the Hill goal, setting up Niewieroski's unassisted game-winner.

Hobart had two chances to tie the contest in the final minute, including a point-blank shot by **DARYL VELTMAN**, but Pfeifer rose to the challenge. Veltman added a goal and three assists to the Hobart effort.

Statesmen goalie **DAN VALENTE** also enjoyed a stellar night, turning away a career-high matching 19 Syracuse offerings.

A wild contest played in front of an overflow crowd of more than 4,000, the two teams combined for 92 shots (Hobart 55-42). Syracuse held a slim 31-29 advantage on ground balls, while the Statesmen won on special teams, scoring a pair of man-up goals (on six chances), while keeping the Orange's man up offense (8th in the nation) without an extra-man goal (0-3).

Stags 11, Statesmen 8

GENEVA, N.Y.—**NATE HILL** scored a game-high four points (3-1), but it wasn't enough to lift the 12th-ranked Statesmen to victory, as visiting Fairfield recorded an 11-8 win.

April showers with a blustery bite soaked the AstroTurf of McCooley Field throughout the contest, making every pass an adventure and chilling players and fans alike to the bone. Despite the challenging conditions, Hobart got off to a fast start.

CHRIS SCANLON and Hill netted back-to-back scores to give the Statesmen a 2-0 lead midway through the first quarter. The Stags evened the ledger with back-to-back extra-man goals by Matt Castele, the second at 3:22 of the opening frame.

Fairfield continued its run with two more unanswered scores, but the Statesmen responded with goals from **MIKE CONKLIN** and **DARYL VELTMAN** to knot the contest, 4-4, with 7:33 remaining in the first half.

The Stags seized the lead for good with the next three goals, in a span of just over three minutes. The first of those tallies—by Travis Nelson set up by Josh Thornton—was also an extra-man goal. Hobart began the week ranked fourth in the nation in man-down defense, and stopped eighth-ranked Syracuse on all three of its man-up tries just four days earlier.

Thornton led Fairfield with three points on two goals and an assist.

SEAN MURPHY finished a feed from Conklin to send the Statesmen into the break down 7-5.

Despite two second half goals from Hill and a strong showing at the faceoff X by **DAN SPINELLA**, Hobart never got closer than its two-goal halftime deficit. Spinella took over the Statesmen faceoffs just before halftime and finished the game with an 8-3 record and three ground balls. Hobart defenseman **MATT MURPHY** picked up a game- and career-high eight ground balls.

Fairfield goalie Michael Kruger, who managed just one save in each of the first three quarters, helped the Stags secure the win with six fourth quarter saves.

Nittany Lions 19, Statesmen 13

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.—**DARYL VELTMAN** scored a career-high eight points against Penn State, but it was the Nittany Lions who posted the ECAC Lacrosse League victory, 19-13, at Jeffrey Field. Veltman's eight points, on four goals and four assists, are the most by a Statesman since **JOHN BOGOSIAN '03** also recorded eight points (6-2) on Feb. 23, 2003.

Penn State needed just five seconds to post its first goal of the contest. It was 2-0 before Veltman finished a feed from **NATE HILL**. The Nittany Lions responded with two more goals, before **PAT MEADE** rifled home an unassisted tally at the 9:40 mark of the first quarter.

PSU rattled off four unanswered goals in just 81 seconds to build an 8-2 lead with 7:28 remaining in the opening stanza. Both teams netted a pair of goals before the close of the opening session to leave Penn State a 10-4 lead.

The Statesmen shook off their poor start to outscore their hosts 5-1 in the second quarter. **RORY MELVIN** got things going with a man-up goal at the 11:44 mark. Less than a minute later, **SEAN REED** buried another extra-man goal. Both tallies were set up by Veltman.

Veltman (pictured below) got a goal of his own at the 7:57 mark, finishing a fast-break feed from defenseman **MATT MURPHY**.

Faceoff specialist Greg Gurenlian netted the only PSU goal of the second quarter, winning the restart and driving straight to the cage. In addition to a goal and an assist, the junior won 21-of-32 faceoffs and collected 13 ground balls.

Hobart closed out the first half scoring on goals by **CHRIS SCANLON** and **MIKE CONKLIN** to trim the Nittany Lions lead to 11-9.

Just 31 seconds into the second half, Veltman, who finished with four goals and four assists, brought the Statesmen within one, 11-10, but Hobart managed just three goals over the final 29 minutes of the contest.

Chris Courteau made eight saves for Penn State, while **MIKE DeSANTIS** allowed 11 goals and made 10 stops in 51 minutes of relief work for the Statesmen.

Minutemen 14, Statesmen 12

GENEVA, N.Y.—Hobart jumped out to a 7-4 lead on 10th-ranked UMass, but the Minutemen rallied for a 14-12 ECAC Lacrosse League victory on Boswell Field.

Hobart's fast start was due in large part to the offensive fireworks of midfielder **CHRIS DAVID**. He scored the game's opening goal 57 seconds into the contest. The team's traded goals over the next five minutes to even the game at 2-2. David then scored back-to-back tallies 38 seconds apart for his fourth hat trick of the season. He led the Statesmen with four goals.

DARYL VELTMAN continued Hobart's run, scoring at the 8:28 mark of the first quarter and setting up **MIKE CONKLIN** 25 seconds into the second quarter. The four unanswered goals gave Hobart a 6-2 lead. Veltman matched David's four points with a goal and three assists, while Conklin contributed three goals.

The Minutemen, who boast the No. 10 scoring offense in the nation, used a 5-1 scoring surge to deadlock the game, 7-7, at halftime. Sean Morris keyed the run with the first and last goal in the series. He finished with a game-high eight points on five goals and three assists.

UMass continued to roll to start the second half, netting four of the first five goals to build an 11-8 lead. Gene Tundo recorded the 11th Minuteman goal at 6:42 of the third quarter. He finished with three goals and an assist.

The teams traded goals over the final 17 minutes as the Statesmen closed to within two on four separate occasions, but could not get any closer.

Hobart dominated the faceoff X, as **JOHN SODEN** (pictured) won 22-of-30 against UMass. The Statesmen also held a 41-36 advantage on shots and picked up 38 ground balls to the Minutemen's 34.

Midfielder **NATE MOLINARI** also record four points for the Statesmen on two goals and two assists.

Statesmen 13, Red Storm 9

QUEENS, N.Y.—Hobart posted a 13-9 ECAC victory over host St. John's at DaSilva Field, ending a four-game slide. **NATE HILL** shared team-high scoring honors with five points and moved into a tie for 18th place in career points (141), the most by a Division I Statesman.

Hobart jumped out to an early 2-0 lead. Hill bounced the first shot of the game past the Red Storm's goalie, finishing a feed from **MIKE CONKLIN** at 14:11. Just over a minute later, **DARYL VELTMAN** finished a perfect cross-crease pass from Hill. St. John's answered with three straight goals for a 3-2 advantage.

The Statesmen squared the match 36 seconds into the second frame when **NATE MOLINARI** threw a dart into the cage from the top of the box. The Red Storm responded with back-to-back goals to take a 5-3 lead.

On Hobart's fourth goal of the day, Hill passed **JAMIE BRESLIN '01** and **MATT CROWTHER '96** on the career scoring list, assisting on a Conklin goal. Breslin, who held the previous mark for points by a Statesman at the Division I level (138), and Crowther were tied for 19th place on the Hobart career scoring list. The teams headed into the break tied 6-6.

To start the second half, St. John's took the first two shots, but goalie **DAN VALENTE** (15 svs) stopped both, including a difficult, off-stick save on a shot from point-blank range.

Hobart seized control of the game with five goals in less than five minutes. **CHRIS SCANLON** got the ball rolling, firing home a laser from left wing at 9:09 of the third quarter. St. John's refused to go away without a fight, scoring three straight goals to start the fourth quarter and trim its deficit to two, 11-9. The Statesmen squelched any thoughts of a comeback with goals by David and Veltman (3-2) in the final five minutes.

Hobart enjoyed a decided advantage at the faceoff X thanks to **JOHN SODEN**, who won 19-of-26 restarts and scooped up a team-leading six ground balls. The Statesmen outshot their hosts 45-32 and picked up 43 ground balls to the Red Storm's 33.

Statesmen 12, Golden Griffins 6

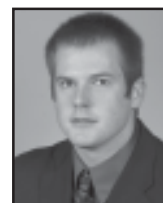

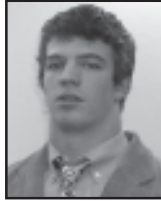
